A Look at the Cardinals

• Ball State will play the second game in a six-game homestand Saturday when it hosts IUPUI for the second straight year at Worthen Arena. The three-day break leading into the game matches the longest stretch without a game for the Cardinals during a busy opening month.

• The Cardinals are coming off a 92-52 win Tuesday over NAIA opponent IU Kokomo. The team reached the 30-assist mark for the seventh time in program history, logging 30 assists on 35 made baskets, and came within two of the school record with 16 made 3-pointers. Ryan Weber (24 points), Francis Kiapway (18) and Tahjai Teague (18) all scored season highs.

• Ball State leads the Mid-American Conference in field goal percentage at 48.1 percent. The Cardinals shot 53 percent in Tuesday's victory over IU Kokomo, topping the 50 percent mark for the third straight game and the fourth time in seven contests this season. The team is shooting 52.6 percent (92 for 175) over the past three games.

• Junior guard Francis Kiapway has heated up over the past two games. A 40 percent 3-point shooter for his career, Kiapway made only 3 of his first 21 attempts from deep this season. But he has made 9 of 16 (56.3 percent) over the past two games.

• Sophomore point guard Tayler Persons had 14 assists Tuesday against IU Kokomo, marking the fourth-most in a game in program history. It was the second double-digit assist performance in the past four games for Persons, who is averaging 8.8 per game over that stretch.

• Ball State has utilized the same starting lineup in all seven games with PG Tayler Persons, SG Francis Kiapway, SF Sean Sellers, PF Franko House and C Trey Moses.

Last Time Out

MUNCIE, Ind. -- The Ball State men's basketball team put on a display of unselfishness and ball movement Tuesday en route to a 92-52 win over IU Kokomo at Worthen Arena.

Senior guard Ryan Weber scored a game-high 24 points as the Cardinals opened up a six-game homestand. Freshman forward Tahjai Teague posted his first career double-double with 18 points and 10 rebounds.

The Cardinals (4-3) recorded assists on 30 of their 35 baskets, highlighted by a career-best 14-assist effort from sophomore point guard Tayler Persons. It was just the seventh game with 30 or more assists in program history. On top of that, the team committed a season-low 10 turnovers.

"We talked a lot about making sure we not only won the game but that we also used the game from start to finish as an opportunity to get better and work on the things we have to work on," Ball State coach James Whitford said. "I thought our guys played the game the right way."

Persons, who entered the night leading the Cardinals with 17.3 points per game, took only three shots and scored six points. He spent most of the night setting up his teammates.

Ball State got open looks and knocked them down. The Cardinals shot 53 percent from the floor and made 16 3-pointers, two shy of the school record.

Junior guard Francis Klapway, who busted out of a shooting slump with three treys Sunday at Valpo, doubled that number Tuesday. He made 6 of 10 attempts from behind the arc to score 18 points.

"Every shooter goes through it from time to time," Whitford said. "It was good to see Francis and Ryan come around. Truth be told, I never really worried about that very much. I was very confident the shooting would come back."

Ball State took a double-digit lead 11 minutes into the game and maintained it the rest of the way. Three-pointers from Klapway and Moses (at the buzzer) in the final minute of the first half pushed the Cardinals' advantage to 43-26 at the break.

Klapway, Weber and Teague combined to score the first 17 points of the second half, as Ball State stretched its lead to 60-26. A free throw from IU Kokomo's Durante Lee finally put an end to a 23-0 run over a span of 3:16 stretching back to the first half.

Ball State expanded its lead to as many as 46 behind the scoring of Teague and Weber, who combined for 27 second-half points.

Moses grabbed a game-high 12 rebounds for a Ball State team that held a 46-29 advantage on the glass.

Beau Dedmond led IU Kokomo (2-7) with nine points, while Max Escamilla had a team-high five rebounds.

Last Year vs. IUPUI

MUNCIE, Ind. -- Ball State pulled out a gritty 61-58 victory over IUPUI at Worthen Arena.

Ball State's offense sputtered much of the game. It shot just 42.6 percent from the field while committing 15 turnovers. The Cardinals also made just 7-of-15 free throws.

After playing a solid up-tempo game and excelling in transition three days earlier in a victory at home against Valparaiso, they needed to hunker down on defense against the Jaguars.

"I feel our team has the right pieces to adapt to a lot of different styles of play," Weber said. "Offensively, we thrive in transition, but we can also grind it out in the half court, especially defensively."

Ball State held IUPUI to 38.7 percent shooting and forced 17 turnovers.

When the Cardinals let a nine-point lead with 3:44 remaining in the game slip to two points with 1:41 left, they relied on their defense to pull them through for the victory.

"Despite some crazy turnovers, we really defended well in some key moments, and that was the difference in the game," Whitford said. "... We made some crazy decisions in transition, and that's not what I want."

Ball State shot 87.8 percent at the free-throw line in the final four minutes in its previous four games. Against IUPUI, the Cardinals hit only 46.7 percent for the game, and went 5-for-11 in the final four minutes.

"We were shooting (72.8) percent for the year, and for whatever reason we make them all or miss them all," Whitford said. "But we're a good free-throw shooting team. I don't think that will be a problem for us long term."

Francis Kiapway, who was 4-for-4 at the line in the final 11 seconds, led the Cardinals with 13 points. Weber had 12 of 4-of-5 shooting from the 3-point line.

Weber, Kiapway Break Out

- After slow starts to the season offensively, senior guard Ryan Weber and junior guard Francis Kiapway have busted out over the past two games.
- Weber is averaging 19.5 points over the past two contests and shooting 60.9 percent from the floor (14 of 23).
- Kiapway is averaging 16.5 points over that span and shooting 54.5 percent (12 of 22).

Big-Time Assist Number

- Tayler Persons' 14-assist performance Nov. 29 against IU Kokomo rates as the fourth-best in program history and the most by a Ball State player since Jamie Matthews against Central Michigan in 1993.

- Senior forward Franko House became the 29th member of Ball State's 1,000-Point Club in the Nov. 27 game at Valparaiso.
- House surpassed the mark with a three-point play in the second half of that game and now owns 1,010 points for his career.

Teague Stuffing the Stat Sheet

- Redshirt freshman Tahjai Teague is making an impact after sitting out last season.
- Teague is averaging 7.9 points per game, while ranking first or second on the team in rebounds (7.3, 2nd), steals (1.6, 1st) and blocks (1.4, 1st) per game.
- He posted his first career double-double Nov. 29 with 18 points and 10 rebounds against IU Kokomo.
- Teague was 8 for 10 from the floor in the IU Kokomo game and ranks third in the MAC with a .618 field goal percentage for the season.

Moses' Efficiency

- Sophomore center Trey Moses has been highly efficient from the floor, especially since the season opener.
- After going 0 for 3 in the opener at Saint Louis, Moses has shot 63.4 percent (26 for 41) over the past six games.

Busy Start

- Tuesday's game against IU Kokomo marked the seventh contest in the first 19 days of the season for Ball State.
- The Cardinals will play 10 times in the season's first 30 days.

Rare Double-Double

- Sophomore point guard Tayler Persons scored 19 points and handed out 10 assists in the Nov. 21 win over Coppin State.
- It was the first points/assists double-double by a Ball State player since Randy Davis had 11 points and 11 assists Nov. 26, 2010 against Southern Utah in the Great Alaska Shootout.
- Persons scored all 19 of his points in the second half against Coppin State.

Pick your Poison

- Ball State has proven 3-point shooters throughout its lineup.
- The Cardinals feature three players with career 3-point shooting percentages of at least 38 percent -- Sean Sellers (42.1), Francis Kiapway (40.0) and Ryan Weber (38.1). All three have at least 250 attempts in their careers.
- Ball State has added more outside shooting threats this year in Tayler Persons (47.4 this season) and Kyle Mallers (43.5).

Big Half

- Ball State had its best offensive half of the season Nov. 23 against Southern Utah in Las Vegas.
- The Cardinals scored 59 points over the final 20 minutes of a 94-83 win.
- The team shot 65.5 percent from the floor (19 of 29), 40 percent from 3-point range (4 of 10) and 85 percent from the free throw line (17 of 20) for the half.

House from Deep

- Franko House went 4 for 4 from 3-point range in the opener at Saint Louis, surpassing his season total of three treys from 2015-16.
- House became the first Ball State post player to make four 3's in a game since Theron Smith against USF in the 2002 NIT.

Moving the Ball

- Ball State leads the MAC with an average of 17.7 assists per game.
- The Cardinals already have four games with at least 19 assists, including a season-high 30 helpers Nov. 29 against IU Kokomo.
- Tayler Persons ranks fourth in the league individually with 5.6 per game.
- The team has recorded assists on 62 percent of its baskets this year (124 of 200).

Persons, Teague Debut

- Ball State will get a boost in 2016-17 from a pair of players who sat out last season -- point guard Tayler Persons and forward Tahjai Teague.
- Persons, the 2015 Atlantic Sun Freshman of the Year at Northern Kentucky, sat out last season as a transfer. In his one season at NKU, he led the Norse in points (13.1) and assists (3.7) per game. He will have three years to play for the Cardinals.
- Teague redshirted last season in his first year with program. He was an Indiana All-Star as a senior at Indianapolis Pike High School in 2015 and was rated as highly as No. 103 nationally in his recruiting class.
- Both players have made an immediate impact. Persons leads the team at 15.7 points and 5.6 assists per game, and Teague averages 7.9 points and 7.3 rebounds per contest.

Picking up Where They Left off

- After making the second-most 3-pointers in program history last season (305), Ball State came out hot from deep in the Nov. 11 opener against Saint Louis.
- The Cardinals went 13 for 23 from beyond the arc in the opener, with seven different players hitting at least one 3.
- The previous time seven Cardinals made at least one trey against a Division I opponent was Jan. 31, 2015 at Miami (Ohio).

25 Years of Worthen

- Ball State will celebrate the 25-year anniversary of Worthen Arena this season.
- The arena opened Jan. 15, 1992 with the Cardinals posting a 70-64 victory over Miami.
- Ball State is 249-114 (.686) all-time inside Worthen Arena.
- The Cardinals have won at least 10 home games in 16 of the previous 24 seasons in the facility. Last year's team won 12 home games.

Cardinals Sign Ishmael El-Amin

- Ball State signed point guard Ishmael El-Amin, one of the top high school players in Minnesota, during the November signing period.
- The 6-foot-4, 175-pound El-Amin averaged 15 points per game last season for Hopkins High School in Minnetonka, Minnesota. He led his team to a 31-1 record, a state championship and a No. 11 national ranking from MaxPreps.
- An all-conference player, El-Amin has been rated as highly as 4 stars by the major recruiting services. He is listed as the seventh-best player in Minnesota's 2017 class by 247Sports.
- El-Amin is the son of professional player and former Connecticut point guard Khalid El-Amin, who led the Huskies to the 1999 NCAA championship.

- Ball State was picked to finish second in the MAC West Division in the preseason poll of head coaches and media members.
- Senior forward Franko House was selected to the Preseason All-MAC West Team.

Welcome to the Program

- Ball State added four scholarship newcomers this offseason with a pair of transfers and two incoming freshmen.
- The Cardinals added combo guard Jontrell Walker from Incarnate Word and graduate big man DouDou Gueye from South Carolina State.
- Gueye has one year to play, while Walker must sit out this season and will then have two years of eligibility left. Walker averaged 13.1 points per game over his first two collegiate seasons and led the nation in free throw shooting last year at 93.3 percent.
- The incoming freshmen are Kyle Mallers from Carroll High School in Fort Wayne, Indiana, and Zach Hollywood from Bradley-Bourbonnais High School in Bradley, Illinois.
- Mallers has played in every game this season, while Hollywood is redshirting.

Recruiting the State

- Ball State's roster this season features five former Indiana All-Stars -- Kyle Mallers (2016), Tahjai Teague (2015), Tayler Persons (2014), Sean Sellers (2014) and Jeremie Tyler (2014).
- It is the most Indiana All-Stars the Cardinals have ever had on the roster at one time.
- Each year the Indiana All-Star Team features the top 13 high school seniors in the state.
- Ball State has had a total of 35 Indiana All-Stars throughout the years.
- The Cardinals had 19 from the 1985-2003 high school graduating classes, coinciding with the most successful period on the court in program history. They then signed only two over the next 10 years before cashing in on the 2014 class.

Reaching the 20-Win Mark

- Ball State's 21 wins last season tied for the seventh-most in school history and were the most since the 2001-02 season (23). The 2015-16 Cardinals tied the 2001-02 team for the program record for games played (35).
- Ball State ended the season at No. 155 out of 351 Division I teams in the Ken Pomeroy rankings. It was the Cardinals' best finish since 2004-05 (No. 105). The team reached as high as No. 127 in the rankings last season.

MAC West Titles

- Ball State shared the 2016 MAC West Division championship with Central Michigan after being picked last in the division's preseason poll.
- Since the MAC went to the divisional format in 1998, Ball State has won or shared five division titles: 1998 (co), 2000 (co), 2002, 2009 (co) and 2016 (co).

Postseason Run

- Ball State made its first postseason appearance since 2002 when it accepted a bid to the 2016 CollegeInsider.com Postseason Tournament (CIT).
- The Cardinals scored massive comeback wins in each of the first two rounds, coming from 17 points down in the opener at Tennessee State and 16 down in the second round against UT Martin.
- The run came to an end in the quarterfinals with a 69-67 loss to eventual tournament champion Columbia.
- Center Trey Moses played the best basketball of his freshman season in the CIT, averaging 13.3 points, 7.7 rebounds and 2.3 assists over Ball State's three games.

Franko House Named All-MAC

- Forward Franko House was named to the All-MAC Second Team and the MAC All-Defensive Team in 2016.
- Of the 20 players in the league selected to an all-conference team, House was the only one to also be named to the all-defensive team.
- House was one of three players in the MAC to rank among the top two on his team in points, rebounds, assists and blocked shots. The other two were Toledo's Nathan Boothe and Kent State's Jimmy Hall.
- House led the Cardinals in points (427) and ranked second on the team in rebounds (202), assists (75) and blocks (19).

Nearly 3-Point Record

- Ball State made 305 3-pointers last season, finishing five shy of the school record (310 in 2001-02).
- The team's 539 treys over the past two seasons are the most in any two-year period for the program since the inception of the 3-point line.
- The Cardinals broke the school record for 3's in a game with 18 on Feb. 27, 2016 versus Eastern Michigan.
- Ball State outscored its opponents 525-369 from beyond the arc in league play.

Individual 3's

- Francis Kiapway ranked third in the MAC last season at 41.8 percent from 3-point range, while Ryan Weber (40.0) was eighth and Sean Sellers (38.8) was 12th.
- Only once previously had Ball State had two players finish the same season at 40 percent or better (minimum 100 attempts) -- Randy Zachary (45.5) and Mark Hardwick (43.9) in 1993-94.
- Kiapway (74 made 3's) and Weber (70) rank third and fourth, respectively, on the Cardinals' list for 3-pointers in a season.
- Last year marked only the second time in program history Ball State had two players make at least 65 3's in a season -- Chris Williams (90) and Patrick Jackson (81) in 2001-02.

Locking It Down

- Even with the increased offense in college basketball last season, Ball State held opponents to 66.8 points per game. That number ranked first in the MAC and 54th in the country.
- The Cardinals held 20 opponents to fewer than 70 points and won 16 of those games.
- Ball State ranked second in the MAC and 40th nationally in field goal percentage defense, holding opponents to 40.5 percent from the floor.

James Whitford enters his fourth season as the Ball State men's basketball head coach in 2016-17, leading a resurgence in the Cardinals' program.

Ball State finished last season 21-14 and shared the Mid-American Conference West Division championship with a 10-8 league mark. The Cardinals earned a berth in the CollegeInsider.com Postseason Tournament (CIT) and reached the quarterfinals.

It marked Ball State's first 20-win season and first postseason appearance in 14 years. Coming on the heels of a seven-win campaign in 2014-15, the Cardinals' turnaround ranked as the fourth-largest of any team in the nation.

Ball State ended the 2015-16 season at No. 155 in the Ken Pomeroy rankings, marking its best finish since the 2004-05 campaign. The Cardinals, who were picked last in the MAC preseason poll, tied the school record for games played in a season with 35.

Ball State led the MAC in scoring defense (66.8) while ranking second in the league and 40th nationally in field goal percentage defense (.405). Offensively, Ball State hit the second-most 3-pointers in school history (305) and finished as the MAC's top assist team during league play at 14.7 per game.

Whitford came incredibly close to winning MAC Coach of the Year honors, finishing second to Akron's Keith Dambrot. He tied Dambrot with 14 first-place votes but ended up one point behind the Akron coach in total points (111-110).

Whitford laid the foundation for the future at Ball State during his first two years, installing his system and ramping up the Cardinals' recruiting efforts. His first two Ball State teams were heavy on youth, with the 2014-15 squad ranking among the 25 youngest in the country. Both teams featured the Mid-American Conference Freshman of the Year, including Sean Sellers in 2014-15.

Whitford signed a 2014 freshman class that included three state champions, a prep school national runner up and, for the first time at Ball State since 1996, two Indiana All-Stars. Scout.com recruiting analyst Brian Snow said of the group, "Ball State's 2014 recruiting class is one of the best mid-major recruiting classes in the country. The future is bright in Muncie."

Whitford has now recruited five former Indiana All-Stars to Ball State -- Sellers, Jeremie Tyler, Tahjai Teague, Tayler Persons and Kyle Mallers. In the decade prior to Whitford's arrival, the Cardinals signed a total of three Indiana All-Stars. The 2016-17 season will mark the first time the Ball State roster has ever included five Indiana All-Stars.

Whitford was introduced as the 19th men's basketball coach in Ball State history on April 10, 2013. In his career as an assistant coach at Arizona, Xavier and Miami University, his teams posted an overall record of 400-208, reached the NCAA tournament 10 times and played in the postseason 13 times.
