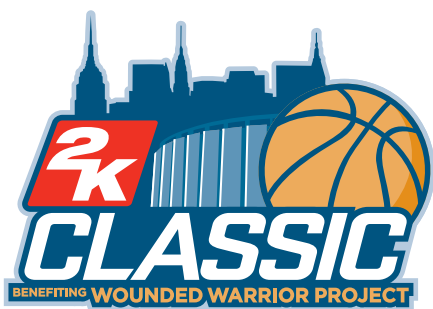

2K CLASSIC: The 2K Classic benefiting Wounded Warrior Project, the nation's premier season-opening college basketball tournament, is celebrating its 22nd anniversary this season and returns to Madison Square Garden for the 19th consecutive year. Teams from across the nation will compete with Michigan, Pittsburgh, Marquette, and SMU serving as regional round hosts. Regional Round action began Nov. 11 with the four hosts advancing to the Championship Rounds, Nov. 17-18, at New York's Madison Square Garden. The remainder of the field will participate in the Subregional Round held at IUPUI, Nov. 18-19.

Joining the four Regional Round hosts in the 2K Classic benefiting Wounded Warrior Project are IUPUI, Eastern Michigan, Gardner-Webb, and Howard.

ABOUT WOUNDED WARRIOR PROJECT: The 2016 2K Classic marks the fourth year that Wounded Warrior Project is the beneficiary of the event. The mission of Wounded Warrior Project is to honor and empower wounded warriors. WWP raises awareness and enlists the public's aid for the needs of injured service members, helps injured servicemen and women aid and assist each other, and provides unique, direct programs and services to meet their needs. 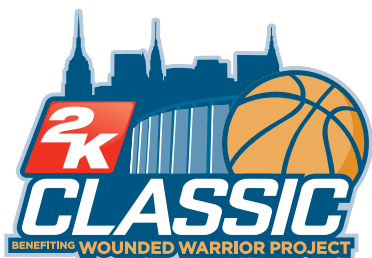

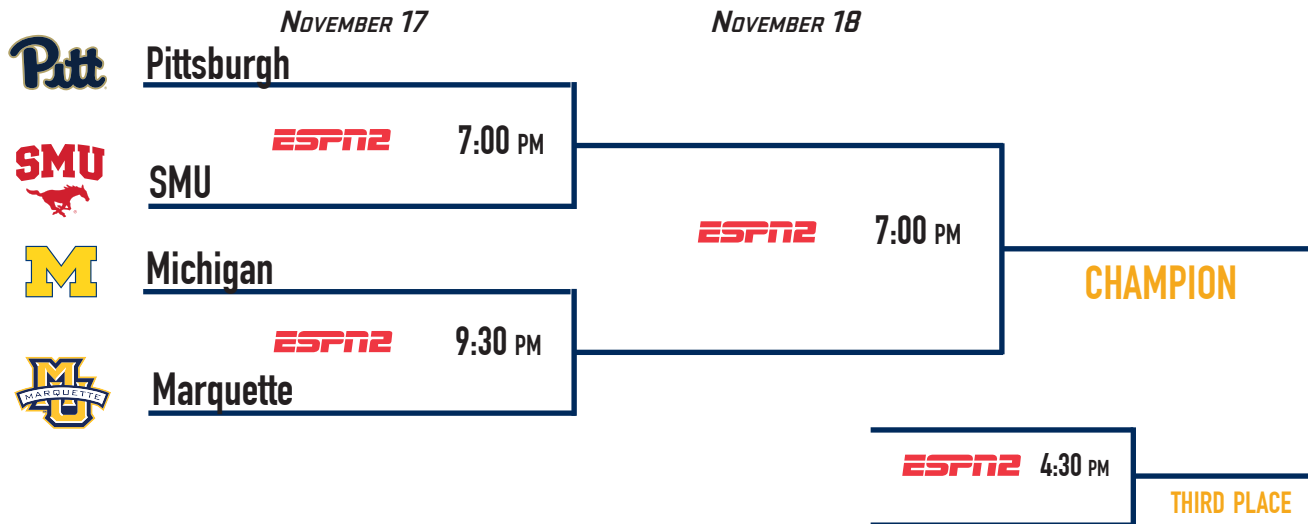

PUNCH YOUR TICKET: Since the beginning of the Classic in 1995, all but three teams that have won the Championship have gone on to the NCAA Tournament. In the previous 21 years, 17 champions have been crowned (there was a showcase format in 1995, 1996, 2002, and 2003). Of those 17 champions, two have won a National Championship (Connecticut, 2013; Florida, 2005), one has lost in the title game (Memphis, 2007), one has advanced to the Elite Eight (Temple, 1998), and five have reached the Sweet 16 (Duke, 2015; Syracuse, 2009; Duke, 2008; Arizona, 2001; and Kansas, 2000). Stanford, which won the 1999 event, is the only tournament champion not to earn a postseason berth.

HELPFUL START: 97 teams that have participated in the 2K Classic benefiting Wounded Warrior Project have gone on to postseason play that year – 67 NCAA, 23 NIT, and 7 CBI. Eight teams have advanced to the Final Four after opening their seasons in the event. Four - Maryland (2001), Syracuse (2002), Florida (2005), and Connecticut (2013) - went on to win the National Championship that spring. Texas (2002), Marquette (2002), George Mason (2005), and Memphis (2007) are the others to reach the Final Four later that season.

HOME SWEET HOME: This year marks the 19th consecutive year that Madison Square Garden will serve as host of the Championship Rounds of the 2K Classic benefiting Wounded Warrior Project. The first two years (1995, 1996) the event was held at what was then known as Convention Hall (now Boardwalk Hall) in Atlantic City, N.J. The 1997 tournament took place at Continental Airlines Arena (now IZOD Center) in East Rutherford, N.J. The event will continue at Madison Square Garden through at least the 2020-21 season.

WELCOME BACK: Pittsburgh, Michigan, Marquette, IUPUI, and Gardner-Webb return to the 2K Classic this season. Pitt is 5-0, winning its lone 2003 game and taking the 2010 title. Michigan is 3-1, having advanced to the 2008 championship game. Marquette is 2-1 with single game appearances in the inaugural 1995 event, as well as 2002 and 2003. IUPUI went 1-1 in the 2008 2K Classic. Gardner-Webb pulled off the biggest upset in tournament history in 2007 when the Runnin' Bulldogs won at No. 22 Kentucky, 84-68, en route to a 2-2 record.

NEW YORK STATE OF MIND: Two student-athletes from the New York metropolitan area will participate in the 2K Classic games at The Garden:

CATAPULTING INTO THE RANKINGS: The Classic has catapulted several teams into the national rankings based on their performance in the event, none so much as Arizona (2001) and Syracuse (2009). The Wildcats entered the 2001 event unranked, but wins over No. 2 Maryland (71-67) and No. 6 Florida (75-71) sent Arizona to No. 8 in the Associated Press poll immediately after the tournament. Syracuse experienced the same rush in 2009. The Orange, unranked in the AP poll and 25th in the ESPN/USA Today poll, won four games in the event, including a semifinal win over No. 12 California (95-73) and a win in the title game against No. 4 North Carolina (87-71). The next week, the Orange were ranked ninth by ESPN/USA Today and 10th by the AP.

THE MAN: Ohio State's Evan Turner posted a triple-double when he went for 14 points, 17 rebounds, and 10 assists in the Buckeyes' 100-60 win over Alcorn State on Nov. 9, 2009. Turner went on to break or tie five tournament records that year to earn all-tournament honors. However, Turner did not earn Most Valuable Player honors in 2009. The award went to Syracuse's Wes Johnson, who led the Orange to the Classic title.

SELECT COMPANY: In the last 11 NBA drafts, 15 players who have played in the 2K Classic benefiting Wounded Warrior Project have been selected in the top 10. Most recently, Duke's Brandon Ingram, who played in the 2015 2K Classic, was chosen second by the Los Angeles Lakers in the 2016 Draft. In 2008 and 2009, the overall top pick was a tournament alum. In 2009 Blake Griffin of Oklahoma was selected by the Clippers and in 2008 Derrick Rose of Memphis went to the Bulls. Illinois' Meyers Leonard just missed out on joining this list as he was selected 11th in the 2012 Draft by Portland. A complete list of tournament NBA draftees can be found in this packet.

THE UNTOUCHABLES: Of the 144 teams that have participated in the event since 1995, only six remain undefeated in Classic play. Pittsburgh (2003, 2010) is tops with a 5-0 record. Kansas (2000), Saint Joseph's (1996, 2003), and Stanford (1999) each own 3-0 records. La Salle (1995) and Penn State (1995) are 1-0 against Classic competition.

DID YOU KNOW...: The four Regional Round hosts of the 2K Classic benefiting Wounded Warrior Project - Michigan, Pittsburgh, Marquette, and SMU - have combined for 95 NCAA Tournament appearances, including 12 Final Fours.

GOLDEN: 2K Classic alums Carmelo Anthony ('02) and Kevin Durant ('06), along with coaches Mike Krzyzewski ('99, '08, '15) and Jim Boeheim ('02, '04, '05, '09, '14) were members of the Team USA gold medal-winning squad at the Rio Olympics this summer.

OLYMPIC HERO: 2002 2K Classic alum Carmelo Anthony of Syracuse holds the USA Olympic record with 336 career points in Olympic competition.

WOODEN YOU KNOW: Seven 2K Classic alumni have gone on to win the John Wooden Award, presented to the national player of the year, including four straight from 2001-04. Six of those players were also honored with the Associated Press and USBWA Player of the Year awards.

DEFINING CHARACTER: John Bach, Naismith Hall of Fame head coach Herb Magee, and women's basketball Hall of Famer Marianne Stanley are the recipients of 2016 Lapchick Character Award, annually given to coaches who have exhibited the character traits of the former St. John's legend.

The awards will be presented at a luncheon in New York on Nov. 18 with the recipients honored that night during the 2K Classic benefiting the Wounded Warrior Project at Madison Square Garden.

Bach, a coaching icon who coached at the collegiate, professional, and international levels, was one of the greatest basketball minds of all-time. A defensive specialist, he has been credited with helping the Chicago Bulls win three straight NBA championships. He is the all-time winningest coach in Fordham history (263-193), and led the Rams to five NIT appearances and a pair of NCAA berths in 18 seasons (1951-68). He passed away in January at the age of 91.

Magee has been the face of the Philadelphia University basketball program for 57 years as a student-athlete and coach. He is just one of two coaches in NCAA history to record 1,000 career wins, accomplishing that on Feb. 7, 2015 with an 80-60 win over Post University. In just his third season at Philadelphia, he led the Rams to the 1970 NCAA College Division National Championship. Now in his 50th year as the Rams' head coach, Magee has amassed 1,032 wins and has led his teams to 29 NCAA Tournaments.

Stanley played at Immaculata College under the legendary Cathy Rush and was part of three AIAW national championship teams in 1972, 1973, and 1974. Her coaching career began in 1976 as an assistant at Immaculata before she was named head coach at Old Dominion the following season. In 10 years at ODU, she guided the Lady Monarchs to a 268-59 record. After leaving ODU, she coached at Penn, USC, Stanford, California, and Rutgers. She appeared in 12 Finals Fours as either a player or a coach. In 2002, she was named WNBA coach of the year with the Washington Mystics. In 2010, she was inducted into the Women's Basketball Hall of Fame and in 2014 was inducted into the Naismith Memorial Basketball Hall of Fame.

In the 10 years under the guidance of head coach John Beilein, U-M has won 191 games and gone to six NCAA Tournaments, including the 2013 national title game...Beilein, who ranks among college basketball's top active coaches with 742 career wins, has recorded 20 20-win seasons in his career, including six at U-M...this season he returns all five starters and 10 experienced and highly-talented players highlighted by senior guards Derrick Walton, Jr. and Zak Irvin, and redshirt-junior swingman Duncan Robinson...Michigan has made 27 NCAA Tournament appearances reaching the Final Four seven times...the Wolverines last participated 2K Classic in 2008, falling to Duke in the championship game.

Kevin Stallings takes over at Pitt after spending the previous 17 seasons at Vanderbilt...he has amassed a 457-283 record with 16 postseason appearances in 24 seasons as a head coach...Stallings inherits a team that has been to the NCAA Tournament 13 of the past 15 seasons (including 2016) and has been to the postseason each of the past 16 years...the Panthers return a loaded roster in 2016-17, led by the All-ACC honorees Michael Young and Jamel Artis...Pittsburgh has been to 26 NCAA Tournaments, including one trip to the Final Four...the Panthers have played in two previous 2K Classics (2003, 2010) and are a perfect 5-0 in those games.

HOW WE GOT HERE

Friday, November 11

The 22nd annual 2K Classic benefiting Wounded Warrior Project began with a bang on Friday evening.

The night started off with an epic double overtime game in Pittsburgh that saw Pitt eventually earn a 93-90 win over Eastern Michigan.

Down 60-50 with 10:24 to play, Eastern Michigan mounted a comeback that culminated with Ty Toney's layup with one second left in regulation to tie the score at 72-72 to send the game into the first overtime. Then Pitt's Jamel Artis free throw with 32 seconds to go tied the game at 83-83, forcing the second extra session. Trailing 91-87, Ray Lee sank a 3-pointer with five seconds remaining to bring EMU to within 91-90. After a pair of Artis free throws increased the lead to 93-90, Toney missed a 3-pointer as the clock wound down and Pitt escaped with its first win under head coach Kevin Stallings.

Artis ended the game with 26 points and nine rebounds. Michael Young also scored 26 points to go along with 10 rebounds and five assists. Sheldon Jeter netted 12 points with nine rebounds and Chris Jones added 10 points, three rebounds, and six assists.

EMU was paced by Lee's 27 points. Tim Bond scored 21 points before fouling out, Toney had 12 points and six assists, and James Thompson had eight points and 13 rebounds.

In Dallas, the Tim Jankovich Era started on a positive note as SMU captured a 72-44 win over Gardner-Webb.

SMU's Semi Ogeye led everyone with 26 points and 14 rebounds. Shake Milton had 13 points for the Mustangs, who also received 11 points and eight assists from Sterling Brown and 11 points from Jarrey Foster.

SMU was not only successful offensively, but also defensively, holding the Runnin' Bulldogs to just 15-of-49 shooting from the field, including 6-of-22 from three.

GWU was led in scoring by Tyrell Nelson and David Efiamay, who netted 13 and 10 points, respectively.

In Ann Arbor, Derrick Walton Jr. scored 20 points and Mark Donnal had 12 points and six rebounds as Michigan defeated Howard, 76-58.

Zak Irvin posted 11 points and five rebounds and D.J. Wilson had nine points and a game-best eight rebounds for the Wolverines.

Howard, playing without James Daniel, who led the nation in scoring a year ago, received 12 points from Damon Collins and 10 points from James Miller.

Sunday, November 13

Michigan and SMU ended their Regional Round play with 2-0 records in the 22nd annual 2K Classic benefiting Wounded Warrior Project on Sunday.

In Ann Arbor, four Wolverines scored in double figures as Michigan captured a 77-65 win over IUPUI. Zak Irvin led the Maize and Blue with 15 points. Mortitz Wagner had 13 points, Derrick Walton Jr. posted 13 points and 14 rebounds, and Muhammad Ali-Abdur-Rahkman netted 12 points.

Michigan outrebounded the Jaguars, 41-30, and had 19 second chance points.

IUPUI was paced by Darell Combs and his game-best 22 points. Matt O'Leary netted 13 points and Kellon Thomas had 10.

In Dallas, five Mustangs netted double figures as SMU earned a 91-64 decision against Eastern Michigan. SMU's Semi Ogeye led SMU with 18 points and eight rebounds with Jarrey Foster also scoring 18 points. Shake Milton tallied 12 points, Sterling Brown had 12 points and Ben Moore added 11 points and six rebounds. As a team, the Mustangs were 29-of-55 from the field.

Eastern Michigan's Ray Lee scored a game-high 26 points and Willie Magnum IV had 16 points.

Monday, November 14

The 2K Classic benefiting Wounded Warrior Project saw the home teams win again on Monday.

In Pittsburgh, Pitt shot 54 percent from the field in taking a 99-80 decision from Gardner-Webb. Cameron Johnson and Michael Young each scored 18 points for the Panthers, who ended the Regional Round of the 2K Classic with a 2-0 mark. Sheldon Jeter had 14 points and a game-high 13 rebounds and Jamel Artis added 11 points and six assists. Speaking of assists, Pitt had 29 assists on 35 field goals.

Gardner-Webb was paced by Laquincy Rideau and his game-high 23 points. He also had six assists. David Efiamay had 20 points and Liam O'Reilly tallied 14 points.

In Milwaukee, five Golden Eagles scored in double figures as Marquette downed Howard, 81-49. Katin Reinhardt and Jajuan Johnson led Marquette with 14 points apiece. Haanif Cheatham and Markus Howard scored 12 each with Cheatham adding seven rebounds and six assists, and Sam Hauser totaled 10 points.

Howard received 15 points from Solomon Mangham.

A BRIEF HISTORY

2015 – Grayson Allen set a tournament record by scoring 62 points in the Championship Rounds (and 116 points in four games) to lead No. 5 Duke to the title. Allen, who was named MVP, had 30 points in a 79-71 semifinal win over VCU and followed that with 32 points in an 86-84 win over Georgetown in the title match. Wisconsin rebounded from a 71-61 loss to Georgetown in the semis to win the consolation game, a 74-73 triumph over VCU.

2014 – No. 10 Texas made it look easy in earning the 2K Classic benefiting Wounded Warrior Project title. In the semifinal game, Jonathan Holmes scored 19 points as the Longhorns downed Iowa, 71-57. Then in the final, Holmes amassed 21 points, 13 rebounds, and two blocked shots as Texas beat California, 71-55. For his efforts, Holmes was named the tournament's MVP. Cal advanced to the final with a 73-59 upset of No. 23 Syracuse.

2013 – No. 18 Connecticut won its two Championship Round games by a combined three points in earning its first Classic Championship in three tries. The Huskies downed Boston College, 72-70, in the semifinals before earning a 59-58 win over Indiana in the title match. It was the smallest margin of victory in the Championship Rounds in the history of the event. Shabazz Napier scored 20 points against Boston College and a game-high 27 points against Indiana to take MVP honors. UConn would go on to win the National Championship as well.

2012 – Alabama's Trevor Releford earned MVP honors, highlighted by his 25-point effort (8-10 FG, 5-5 3FG) in the Championship Game, as the Crimson Tide rolled to the tournament title. 'Bama downed Villanova, 77-55, in the title match after Rodney Cooper hit the game-winning shot in Alabama's 65-62 semifinal win over Oregon State the night before. The crown marked the second year in a row that an SEC school emerged victorious.

2011 – Mississippi State downed No. 18 Texas A&M and No. 16 Arizona to win the championship. New York native Arnett Moultrie is named the Classic's MVP.

2010 – Pittsburgh, ranked fourth nationally, squeaked by No. 22 Texas, 68-66, to win its first ever title. Ashton Gibbs is named the tournament's Most Valuable Player.

2009 – For the first time in the history of the event, four nationally-ranked teams participate in the Championship Rounds at Madison Square Garden. In the ESPN/USA Today preseason coaches' poll, North Carolina is ranked fourth, California is 12th, Ohio State is 17th, and Syracuse is 25th. When it was all over, Wes Johnson became a NBA lottery pick in leading Syracuse to its second Classic title.

2008 – No. 5 Duke barely broke a sweat with Championship Round wins over Southern Illinois (83-58) and Michigan (71-56).

2007 – The biggest upset in Classic history occurred in Lexington as Gardner-Webb downed No. 22 Kentucky, 84-68. No. 3 Memphis would go on to win the title with wins over Oklahoma and Connecticut.

2006 – Although his team did not win the title, Texas freshman Kevin Durant proved why he was the nation's top player by scoring 91 points and hauling down 38 rebounds in the first four games of his collegiate career.

2005 – Eventual national champion Florida tipped off its national title run with wins over No. 18 Wake Forest and No. 16 Syracuse at The Garden.

2004 – A new expanded format featuring 16 teams and four regional sites debuted. Saint Mary's upset California to crash a Top 25 party at MSG, but it was No. 6 Syracuse which came away with the title after beating No. 24 Memphis, 77-62.

2003 – As in 2002, the event featured two doubleheaders rather than a tournament format. The 2003 Classic witnessed the emergence of Jameer Nelson, who had 20 points, eight rebounds, and 10 assists in a 73-66 win over No. 10 Gonzaga. Nelson would go on to lead Saint Joseph's to the Elite Eight of the NCAA Tournament and garner national Player of the Year honors.

2002 – The previous three events each featured three ranked teams. The 2002 tournament featured three teams that would go on to the 2003 Final Four. Eventual national champion Syracuse lost to Memphis on the first day while Marquette and Texas won their games on the event's second day. Future NBA stars Carmelo Anthony, Dwyane Wade, T.J. Ford, and Mo Williams are named to the all-tournament team.

2001 – Unranked Arizona beat No. 2 Maryland and No. 6 Florida to earn the title.

2000 – No. 7 Kansas beat hometown favorite St. John's to win the championship. St. John's advanced with a 62-61 win over No. 12 Kentucky which saw the Red Storm come back from four down with 22 seconds left. Kansas, Kentucky, and UCLA would each advance to the 2001 NCAA Sweet 16.

1999 – 1998-99 national finalists UConn and Duke joined Stanford and Iowa to form the strongest field to date. However, it was the Cardinal, behind twins Jason and Jarron Collins and their combined 35 points and 22 rebounds, who won the title with a 72-58 win over Iowa. UConn beat Duke in the consolation game, sending the Blue Devils to 0-2 for the first time in more than 40 years.

1998 – The Classic moved to its permanent home, Madison Square Garden. Seventh-ranked Temple overcame a 16-point deficit to beat Wake Forest in the championship game.

1997 – The first "tournament" in event history is held and it was Princeton which emerged victorious. After beating No. 22 Texas, the Tigers downed NC State at the Meadowlands for the title. Princeton would eventually be ranked as high as seventh this season.

1996 – It was a good day for Philadelphia as Temple and Saint Joseph's earned wins in the doubleheader in Atlantic City. The Hawks would go on to the Sweet 16 of the NCAA Tournament. The Coaches vs. Cancer program became the beneficiary of the event.

1995 – The inaugural event, known as the Atlantic City Shootout, was a doubleheader at the Atlantic City Convention Center (now Boardwalk Hall). Penn State's Pete Lisicky scored 35 points to lead the Nittany Lions to an 88-61 win over Penn. With 17 seconds left in the day's second game, Olof Landgren hit a layup to give La Salle a 68-66 upset victory over Marquette.

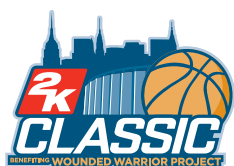
