Opening Tips

- Illinois returns to State Farm Center this week for its final two non-conference home games, beginning with Tuesday night's match-up against IUPUI (7 p.m., ESPN3).
- Illinois carries a two-game winning streak after defeating N.C. State in the ACC/Big Ten Challenge and VCU in the Hoophall Miami Invitational. The victory over VCU was the 1,750th win in program history. The Illini are the NCAA's 14th-winningest team all-time.
- The Illini have grabbed double-digit offensive rebounds in each of the last four games, totaling 54 over this stretch (13.5 avg.). It is the UI's most offensive boards over a four-game stretch since Jan. 4-12, 2014 (64).
- Illinois is 5-0 this season when shooting better than its opponent.
- Since his return, sophomore Leron Black has averaged 12.8 points and 8.0 rebounds over the last five games.
- Senior Malcolm Hill eclipsed the 1,400-point marker against VCU and enters the IUPUI game tied for 18th on the Illini all-time scoring list (1,409 pts).
- Senior Tracy Abrams is 11 points away from becoming the 49th player in school history to score 1,000 career points.

Notes from the Last Time Out: Illini 64, VCU 46 (Dec. 3)

- Illinois held VCU to the Rams lowest point total (46) in the last 11 seasons, since a 60-40 loss at UNC Wilmington on Dec. 4, 2005.
- The 46 points were the fewest allowed by the Illini since giving up 45 to Kennesaw State on Dec. 27, 2014.
- The Illini also forced 14 VCU turnovers, converting those into 23 points. Illinois' +17 advantage in points off turnovers was its largest margin in a game this season.
- Illinois did not allow VCU to make a field goal in the final 7:37 of the game, when the UI lead was 44-40. The Orange and Blue finished with a 20-6 run the rest of the way, limiting the Rams to just six free throws and 0-for-6 shooting.
- After falling behind 11-3 early and making just one of its first 12 shots, Illinois used a 19-to-3 first half run to take a 22-14 lead 4:46 before halftime. The Illini led the rest of the way.
- **Leron Black** earned Hoophall Miami Invitational MVP honors after recording a game-high and career-high tying 18 points to go along with eight rebounds in his first start of the season.
- **Malcolm Hill** scored 16 points to bring his career scoring total to 1,409, tying him with Kendall Gill for 18th on the UI all-time scoring list.
- Jalen Coleman-Lands hit a career-high five 2-point field goals and finished with 12 points in his first start of the year. He was 5-of-6 from inside the arc after entering the game just 2-of-14 on twos for the season.

Illini Team Trends

- Illinois ranks fourth in the Big Ten and 84th in the NCAA in scoring offense, averaging 79 ppg. The Illini have scored at least 79 points in five of its six wins, with Saturday's victory over VCU its first of the season under that marker.
- Illinois has won all six of its games by at least 14 points.
- The Illini are third in the Big Ten and 52nd nationally in 3-point field goal percentage at 39.1 percent. Illinois' 75 made threes ranks 50th in the NCAA.

- ullet Illinois has been strong on the offensive glass so far this season, recording double digits in six of nine games including each of the last four and averaging 10.7 o-boards per game. Last season Illinois ranked last in the Big Ten with 7.6 offensive rebounds per contest.
- The Illini have shot better from the field in the second half compared to the first in seven of nine games.
- Illinois has shot at least 50 percent during the second half in all six of its wins.
- Illinois is shooting 50.4 percent in six games at State Farm Center (187-371), compared to just 38 percent in three games away from home (63-166).
- Illinois has done an outstanding job taking care of the basketball under Coach John Groce, with each of the last three seasons ranking as the fewest average turnovers in school history (2015-9.9, 2014-10.4, 2016-10.5). It is a sharp contrast to see Illinois currently averaging 13.9 turnovers through nine games this year, with seven games in double digits. The Illini have improved in this area recently, averaging just 11.0 turnovers over the last three games (33) compared to 20.3 turnovers the previous three games (61).

Illini Player Trends

- Wooden Award and Naismith Trophy candidate Malcolm Hill ranks third in the Big Ten in scoring (18.4 ppg).
- Hill has scored in double figures in seven of eight games against D1 opponents, with four outings of 20+ points.
- Hill has reached double figures in each of the last three games, averaging 18.7 points (56).
- Hill ranks 22nd in the nation by kenpom with an offensive rating of 116.0 (28 percent possessions used).
- Hill's career-high 40 points vs. Northern Kentucky (Nov. 13) is tied for the No. 3 scoring performance in the NCAA so far this season.
- Hill is currently shooting 44.7 percent from 3-point range (11th in Big Ten) after never topping 39 percent in any of his first three seasons and entering his senior year as a 35 percent career 3-point shooter.
- Hill has made 21 threes in nine games after making 37 treys in 34 games last season.

Hill Named Big Ten Co-Player of the Week After Historic Performance

Fighting Illini senior guard Malcolm Hill was named Big Ten Co-Player of the Week on Nov. 14 after leading Illinois to a pair of wins. Hill dominated the season's opening weekend, averaging 30.5 points and 10.0 rebounds on 55.9 percent shooting from the field, including 50 percent from 3-point range, in victories over Southeast Missouri and Northern Kentucky.

He scored a career-high 40 points vs. Northern Kentucky, equaling the fifth-highest scoring game in school history and topping his previous career-high of 39 points set last season at Penn State in double-overtime.

Hill became just the sixth Illini player ever in the 40-point club while recording only the second 40-point performance by an Illini in the last 26 seasons.

Hill made 13-of-23 from the field against NKU, including a career-high five 3-pointers on eight attempts. It marked Hill's fifth career 30-point outing. He also recorded his eighth career double-double, grabbing a team-high 12 rebounds.

Hill opened the season with game highs of 21 points and eight boards vs. Southeast Missouri. He did most of his damage in the second half of both games, scoring 16 of his 21 against SEMO and 29 of his 40 vs. NKU after intermission. He also earned his way to the foul line with regularity, combining for 16 points on 19 free throw attempts (84.2 percent).

Illini Sign Top-10 Recruiting Class

Head coach John Groce has signed four student-athletes to national letters of intent in center **Jeremiah Tilmon** (East St. Louis, III.) and guards **Trent Frazier** (Wellington, Fla.) **Javon Pickett** (Belleville, III.) and **Da'Monte Williams** (Peoria, III.). It is a national top-10 class according to three major recruiting services, checking in at No. 8 by Scout, No. 9 by ESPN and No. 10 by 247Sports. It also is ranked by every service as the top class in the Big Ten.

Tilmon is a consensus national top-25 recruit, ranked No. 19 by Scout and No. 25 by both Rivals and 247Sports composite. He is the highest-rated recruit of Groce's Illinois tenure and is the first five-star player to select the Fighting Illini since 2010. Tilmon averaged 13 points and eight rebounds as a junior at La Lumiere, a prep school in La Porte, Indiana. He is now at East St. Louis Senior High School for his senior season.

Frazier is a four-star recruit ranked No. 78 by Scout, No. 101 by Rivals and No. 102 by 247Sports composite. He averaged 21 points, six assists and 2.2 assists as a junior at Wellington High School. He led Wellington to the Class 8A state championship as a sophomore and quarterfinal appearance as a junior. Frazier was a first-team All-State pick by the Florida Association of Basketball Coaches and All-Area Player of the Year by the *Palm Beach Post*.

Picket is a three-star recruit who averaged 23.5 points and 6.4 rebounds as a junior at Belleville East High School, shooting 55 percent from the field. He scored a career-high 42 points vs. East St. Louis. Pickett was a first-team All-State selection by the Associated Press, *Chicago Sun-Times, Champaign News Gazette* and Illinois Basketball Coaches Association (IBCA).

Williams is a four-star recruit ranked No. 92 by ESPN, No. 106 by Rivals and No. 107 by 247Sports composite. He led Peoria Manual High School to its first IHSA large-class state finals appearance since 1997, where the Rams finished third. Williams averaged 15.3 points, 5.9 rebounds, 2.3 assists and 2.1 steals as a junior, scoring a career-high 37 points vs. Joliet West. He earned first-team All-State honors by the Associated Press and IBCA. Williams is the son of Illini all-time great point guard Frank Williams, the 2001 Big Ten Player of the Year and two-time All-American.

Renovated State Farm Center Complete

Known as Assembly Hall from its construction in 1963 to 2013, the iconic home to Illinois basketball was renamed State Farm Center on April 29, 2013, with the announcement of a 30-year, \$60 million naming rights agreement. State Farm Center underwent a major renovation, which began following the conclusion of the 2013-14 basketball season, dubbed the Illinois Renaissance. The \$170-million project included a renovated seating bowl; the addition of four levels of premium seating; improved restrooms and conces-

The construction schedule was year-round, with the major elements occurring around each Fighting Illini basketball season. The most labor intensive part of the renovation began immediately following the final home game of the 2014-15 season, when the lower half of the seating bowl was torn out and reconstructed.

The project concluded in time for the start of the 2016-17 season. The official dedication for renovated State Farm Center took place Nov. 29, when the Illini hosted North Carolina State in the ACC/Big Ten Challenge.

2016-17 PRESEASON NOTES

Setting the Stage

This year's Fighting Illini squad has depth and experience, welcoming back a total of 12 letterwinners and approximately 77 percent of its points, 72 percent of its rebounds and 75 percent of its minutes from the 2015-16 campaign. Illinois returns six of its top seven scorers and will be strengthened by the addition of a number of key players who were limited last year with injuries.

Versatile Hill Does it All

With seven players combining to miss a total of 101 games and 14 different starting units, lineup changes existed throughout last season. One constant though for the Illini was the stellar all-around play of Malcolm Hill. Asked to play all five positions over the course of the year, Hill led the team in practically every statistical category while becoming the first player in school history to record 600 points, 200 rebounds and 100 assists in a single season.

Hill was the only Big Ten player to lead his team in scoring, rebounding and assists, earning second-team allconference accolades. He ranked third in the league in scoring at 18.1 points per game, the highest average by an Illini in 13 years. He also averaged 6.6 rebounds (ninth in Big Ten) and 3.3 assists. Hill's season total of 614 points ranked sixth on the all-time UI list. He scored 20 or more in 16 games, led by a career-high 39 points at Penn State, the sixth-best single-game performance in school history.

Hill is on preseason watch lists for the Wooden Award, Naismith Trophy and Jerry West Award, and also was selected to the Preseason All-Big Ten Team.

Long-Awaited Comeback for Abrams

Following back-to-back season-ending injuries, senior Tracy Abrams has recovered from those setbacks and will take the court for his final collegiate campaign after receiving a medical hardship waiver for a sixth-year of eligibility. Abrams missed the entire 2014-15 season after tearing his ACL in September, then missed all of last season after tearing his Achilles tendon in July.

Prior to the injuries, Abrams had been a mainstay in the starting lineup since midway through his freshman season. He ranked second on the team in scoring as a junior in 2013-14, averaging 10.7 points, and led the Illini in assists (3.2 apg). No parts of his game will be more valued by his teammates, however, than the leadership skills and toughness he brings to the court.

Extra Year for Thorne Too

Illinois is in the unique, and perhaps unprecedented, position of having two sixth-year players on the same roster. Senior Mike Thorne Jr. also received a medical hardship waiver to extend his eligibility to a sixth season.

Thorne made a big impact on the Illini last year as a graduate transfer with his ability to score in the paint and rebound. He averaged 12.9 points and 8.5 rebounds in eight games, but missed most of the season after tearing his meniscus against Iowa State on Nov. 28. Thorne was Illinois' leading rebounder in six of his eight games and scored in double figures five times.

Senior Depth

Maverick Morgan is another senior the Illini will depend on in the frontcourt. He averaged 8.3 points last year and was a breakout player late in the season, averaging 12.0 points over the final 12 games, including 13.8 ppg over the last five. Morgan led the Illini in field goal shooting at 56.4 percent (eighth in Big Ten), highlighted by a 10-for-13 effort en route to a career-high 21 points at Maryland.

After leading the Illini in assists two years ago, Jaylon Tate suffered a dislocated finger in last year's season opener that forced him to miss 4.5 games and caused discomfort throughout the year. He still totaled 75 assists and now enters his senior season back at full force. Tate provides veteran experience and stability at point guard. The sixth and final senior is Alex Austin, a walkon who is coming off his first action with the Illini after sitting out as a transfer following two years at Eastern Illinois. Austin played in 32 games last year, starting six times, and averaged nearly 10 minutes per game for the Illini. He is one of the team's top perimeter defenders.

Coleman-Lands Sets Record

The Illini coaching staff felt it had recruited one of the nation's top shooters in the class of 2015 in **Jalen Coleman-Lands**. And JCL delivered in his inaugural season, torching the nets with 87 three-pointers to break the Illinois freshman record. Coleman-Lands was fourth in the Big Ten with an average of 2.6 treys while shooting 42.2 percent behind the arc to rank eighth in the league. He was the team's third-leading scorer with an average of 10.3 points, reaching double figures 19 times. Coleman-Lands missed most of the preseason with a broken hand suffered Sept. 7 but returned to practice in late October.

Frontcourt Bolstered with Finke and Black

The Illini will look for strong contributions from redshirt sophomores **Michael Finke** and **Leron Black** with their contrasting frontcourt styles. After redshirting his first season on campus, Finke had a number of bright moments last year. He started 16 games and averaged 7.5 points. A stretch-four with good passing skills, Finke shot 36.7 percent from 3-point range while knocking down 40 treys. He scored in double figures 10 times, led by a 24-point outing vs. Western Carolina.

Black was slowed following October surgery for a torn meniscus. He was limited to seven games, averaging 4.4 points and 4.4 rebounds, before sitting out the rest of the season and taking a medical redshirt. The Illini missed his presence on the glass, and he will be counted on for his rebounding ability this year. Black was suspended through the first four regular season games and returned to the court on Nov. 21 vs. Winthrop.

Also Returning for the Orange and Blue

Rounding out the Illini letterwinners are Aaron Jordan, D.J. Williams and Cameron Liss, joined by returnee Kipper Nichols.

Jordan played in 31 games as a freshman, averaging 3.3 points, led by a season-high 14 points in his debut vs. North Florida. Williams, meanwhile, appeared in 29 games and averaged 2.1 points. He earned more playing time as the season evolved, logging double digit minutes in 11 of the last 12 games. Both players have worked hard in the offseason on skill development and improvements in the weight room and look to take the next step in their progression as sophomores.

Liss is returning for his third year as a walkon, providing depth in practice for the UI frontcourt while sitting out the season as a redshirt.

Nichols joined the Illini last season at the semester break. He sat out the spring and will miss the fall semester as well per transfer rules after originally signing with Tulane. The redshirt freshman is expected to be eligible beginning with the BYU game on Dec. 17. Nichols is a powerful 6-6 forward with the ability to defend multiple positions.

New Additions

There are four newcomers to the Illini roster this season in freshmen Te'Jon Lucas and walkons Clayton Jones, Drew Cayce and Samson Oladimeji.

Lucas was a unanimous first-team All-State selection in Wisconsin after averaging 20.5 points and 7.8 assists as a senior at Milwaukee Washington High School. He also was chosen as the state's top senior point guard. Lucas' season was cut short after fracturing his ankle in a game on Feb. 6. He focused on recovering from that injury through the summer, which limited his on-court activity. Lucas returned to full contact at the start of preseason practice in October.

Jones is a Champaign native who joins the program after attending junior college the previous three years, last competing with Lake Land during the 2014-15 season. Jones is a competitor and solid 3-point shooter who will push his fellow Illini guards.

Cayce will sit out this season after transferring from Creighton, where he redshirted last year as a freshman. Cayce will focus on helping the Illini backcourt in daily practices.

Oladimeji joined the Illini at the start of fall practice to participate on the scout team.

HEAD COACH JOHN GROCE

5th Year at Illinois // 9th Year Overall // 24th Year as a College Coach

John Groce enters his fifth season in charge of the Fighting Illini program in 2016-17. He has led the Illini to an average of more than 19 wins per season during his tenure along with postseason appearances in three of his first four years in Champaign, owning a record of 77-61.

Groce continues his relentless pursuit to build a championship program in all phases. There have been signature wins on the court, player development improvements, recruiting success, and achievement in the classroom as well. Illinois has carried a team GPA over 3.0 for five consecutive semesters, highlighted by a 3.27 in fall 2015 – tied for the highest among all UI men's teams – and a 3.07 in spring 2016. A team-record six players earned 2015-16 Academic All-Big Ten accolades, and the program's most recent NCAA Academic Progress Rate (APR) multiyear score of 990 ranked third in the Big Ten.

Last year's team dealt with an unprecedented number of injuries. Groce employed 14 different starting lineups as a total of seven players missed a combined 101 games. But the Illini continued to battle in the face of adversity, playing 14 contests that were either decided by five points or less or tied at the end of regulation. Illinois won 15 games, including top-25 victories over No. 20 Purdue at home and against No. 20 lowa in the Big Ten Tournament second round, with the Illini becoming the lowest seed ever to advance to the league's tournament quarterfinal.

During the 2014-15 season, Groce directed Illinois to 19 wins and its first .500 campaign in Big Ten play since 2011. After falling just shy of an NCAA Tournament bid, the Illini earned a No. 3 seed in the NIT. Off the court, meanwhile, the coaching staff continued to strengthen the Fighting Illini roster for the future by signing a top-20 recruiting class, the Ul's second nationally ranked class in Groce's first three seasons.

Illinois went perfect in the month of November for the third straight year, capped with a victory over Baylor in the Las Vegas Invitational title game that moved the Illini into the Top 25 rankings. Another non-conference highlight was the first buzzer beater in the history of the Braggin' Rights series, as Rayvonte Rice drained a 3-pointer with time expiring to give the Illini a second-straight victory over Missouri.

Included in the UI's nine conference wins were three victories over teams that finished in the top four of the Big Ten standings. The Illini took down 11th-ranked Maryland and Purdue at home and defeated eventual Final Four participant Michigan State on the road.

Illinois' two RPI top-10 wins tied for second nationally during the regular season. Groce's third Fighting Illini squad also set a pair of statistical milestones, leading the nation in free throw percentage with school-record accuracy of 79.4 percent, and setting another program record for fewest turnovers per game at 9.9.

Groce guided one of the youngest and most inexperienced teams in the nation during the 2013-14 season to 20 wins and a No. 2 seed in the NIT, as the Illini narrowly missed a trip to the NCAA Tournament. Entering the year with nine newcomers and returning just three rotation players, Groce emphasized defense to his young squad and it delivered, finishing the season ranked 11th nationally in defensive efficiency.

Illinois won 13 of its first 15 games, highlighted by thrilling wins at UNLV, in the Braggin' Rights game over No. 23 Missouri and against Indiana in overtime on New Year's Eve. The Illini then played some of their best basketball late in the season, a staple of Groce's teams throughout his coaching career. Illinois won four of its last five regular season games, with three of those victories coming on the road at Minnesota, at No. 18 Michigan State and at No. 24 lowa. The Illini added wins over Indiana in the first round of the Big Ten Tournament and at Boston U in the first round of the NIT to finish the season with six victories over its final nine contests, with both postseason losses coming by just one point apiece.

Groce led the Illinois program to a number of achievements during his first year in 2012-13 — including 23 victories that marked a six-win improvement from the Ul's previous season — culminating in an NCAA Tournament appearance and

subsequent victory to advance to the Round of 32.

Illinois won its first 12 games in 2012-13, equaling the sixth-best start in school history and matching the best start ever for a first-year UI coach. Included in that stretch was a dominating performance in Hawaii as the Illini captured the school's first-ever Maui Invitational championship. Illinois also recorded arguably the most impressive win of college basketball's pre-conference season, winning at No. 10 Gonzaga by double digits.

The Illini spent eight weeks ranked in the Top 25, reaching as high as No. 10 in the national polls. Illinois recorded two more top-10 wins during conference play in one of the most difficult seasons in Big Ten history. The Illini defeated No. 8 Ohio State on Jan. 5 by 19 points, the UI's largest margin of victory over a top-10 opponent since 1964. Then on Feb. 7, Illinois garnered national headlines with a thrilling last-second home victory over No. 1 Indiana. The Illini won it at the buzzer on a layup by Tyler Griffey, leading to a court storming celebration as Illinois defeated a No. 1-ranked opponent for just the third time in school history.

The Fighting Illini earned a No. 7 seed in the NCAA Tournament and defeated No. 10 Colorado as Groce improved his record in the opening round of the Tournament to 9-0 during his coaching career, and 3-0 as a head coach.

In addition to the success on the court, Groce also made an immediate impact on the recruiting trail, signing a top 25-ranked class in less than eight months on the job in Champaign.

Groce was named the 17th Fighting Illini men's basketball coach on March 29, 2012. He arrived at Illinois after four seasons as head coach at Ohio University, where he led the Bobcats to an 85-56 overall record as well as Mid-American Conference Tournament titles and NCAA Tournament appearances in 2010 and 2012.

Ohio was the story of the 2012 Tournament, advancing to the Sweet 16 as a No. 13 seed with victories over No. 4 seed Michigan followed by No. 12 seed South Florida. The Bobcats made a strong push for the Elite Eight before falling to No. 1 seed North Carolina in overtime in the regional semifinal. It marked just the second time in Ohio's school history and first since 1964 that the Bobcats wo multiple games in the NCAA Tournament. Ohio finished the 2012 season with a school-record 29 wins and was known for its pressure defense, ranking second nationally in turnover percentage and third in steals percentage.

Ohio also made noise in the 2010 postseason. Playing in the school's first NCAA Tournament game in five seasons, the Bobcats received a No. 14 seed and defeated No. 3 seed Georgetown. With the 2010 and 2012 NCAA performances, Ohio became just the sixth school ever to win Tournament games as both a 13 and 14 seed

The 45-year-old Groce has a total of 23 years in the coaching profession and has been part of teams that have made 19 postseason appearances. His record in 15 years as an assistant was an impressive 349-156, giving him a combined record of 511-273.

Groce earned his first head-coaching job at Ohio following four seasons on Thad Matta's staff at Ohio State from 2005-08, the first two as assistant coach and last two as associate head coach. During Groce's time in Columbus the Buckeyes amassed a record of 105-35, advanced to the NCAA Championship game in 2006, claimed back-to-back outright Big Ten Championships in 2006 and 2007 and won the NIT in 2008. Groce played a key role in recruiting many of the top players at Ohio State and was named Rivals' 2006 National Recruiter of the Year.

In all, Groce spent eight years as an assistant under Matta. Prior to his time at Ohio State, Groce served three years on Matta's staff at Xavier from 2002-04 and one season at Butler in 2001. The Musketeers went 78-23 and made three straight NCAA appearances, advancing to the second round in 2002 and 2003 and the Elite Eight in 2004. Xavier also won consecutive Atlantic 10 titles in 2002 and 2003. Butler, meanwhile, went 24-8 and won a conference crown in 2001 while also advancing to the second round of the NCAA Tournament.

Groce entered the Division I coaching ranks as a member of Herb Sendek's staff at North Carolina State from 1997-2000. The Wolfpack went 73-58 overall and advanced to the NIT in each of the four seasons Groce was in Raleigh, including a trio to the semifinals in 2000.

Groce got his start in coaching as an assistant at his alma mater, Taylor University in Upland, Indiana. Groce spent three years on Paul Patterson's staff from 1994-96, helping lead the Trojans to a 69-32 record and pair of trips to the NAIA national tournament. Groce played for Patterson for three years from 1991-93 before making the transition to a student assistant role as a senior. Taylor compiled a 90-16 record and made three trips to the NAIA Tournament during Groce's playing career, including a 1991 Final Four appearance during his freshman season.

Groce earned a bachelor's degree in mathematics from Taylor in 1994. John and his wife, Allison, have two sons, Conner and Camden, and a daughter, Cate.

Led by Malcolm Hill's career-high 40 points. Illinois stormed back to defeat Northern Kentucky at State Farm Center and improve to 2-0 on the young season.

The Illini trailed by as many as eight points in the first half before closing to within two at the break. Illinois then pulled away in the second half to record its 24th win under Coach Groce after trailing at halftime.

With the game tied at 50, the Orange and Blue used an 11-0 run — with nine of those 11 points coming from Hill — to take a 61-50 lead with eight minutes remaining. The Illini did not look back on its way to the 15-point victory.

Game 3 Recap - Illini 112, McKendree 65 (Nov. 15)

Six players scored in double figures and the Illini tied their school record with 16 made 3-pointers in a blowout win over McKendree at State Farm Center.

Illinois shot 55.7 percent on the night and made 57.1 percent from 3-point range, knocking down 16-of-28 from behind the arc. The Illini set a new record at State Farm Centers with the 16 treys while equaling the program's all-time best first set in 2005 Elite Eight victory over Arizona.

In addition to the red-hot shooting, the Illini also dominated inside, scoring 50 points in the paint. Illinois recorded 28 assists, its highest total in the last 15 seasons, and enjoyed a 20-to-5 advantage in points off turnovers.

Illinois led from start to finish in a 20-point victory over Detroit Mercy at State Farm Center, improving to 4-0.

Illinois jumped out to a quick 14-5 lead and led by as many as 15 in the first half. The Illini then came out on fire after halftime, scoring on 10 of its first 14 possessions and draining 10 of its first 13 field goal attempts to take a commanding 27-point lead with 10:30 left.

Illinois led nearly the entire game but was unable to close things out, as Winthrop stormed back to become the first visitor to win a November game at State Farm Center in 10 years.



Game 7 Recap - #25/- Florida State 72, Illini 61 (Nov. 25)

Illinois put itself in position to earn a win over a top-25 team, but No. 25 Florida State pulled away in the final 10 minutes to win the third-place game of the NIT Season Tip-Off at Barclays Center.

The Illini showed a strong response in battling back less than 24 hours after a semifinal round loss to No. 19 West Virginia. Illinois had just three first-half turnovers and got plenty of great looks in the opening 20 minutes of play, but had trouble converting with just 9-of-33 shooting (27.3 percent).

The Illini were the aggressor on the boards, outrebounding the bigger Seminoles by eight and grabbing 16 offensive rebounds for the second straight day. That led to a 20-to-8 UI advantage in second-chance points.

There were numerous lead changes and ties throughout the game, as the entire first 30 minutes was played within a margin of two-possessions. But Malcolm Hill's fourth personal foul and five Illini turnovers ignited a critical 24-7 Florida State run that turned a 44-42 Illini lead with 11:56 remaining into a 66-51 FSU advantage with 3:40 left.

Malcolm Hill scored a game-high 18 points and Leron Black recorded his third career double-double with 15 points and game-high 11 rebounds. Freshman **Te'Jon Lucas** also played well, scoring a season-high 10 points and dishing out a game-high four assists in 18 minutes.

Game 8 Recap - Illini 88, North Carolina State 74 (Nov. 29)

Illinois snapped a three-game skid and won its first ACC/Big Ten Challenge game since 2012, using a strong second half to pull away from N.C. State in the dedication game of the renovated State Farm Center.

Illinois led for most of the first half before a late 10-2 run gave N.C. State its biggest lead of the game at 33-27. The Illini pulled to within one at the break and early in the second half scored six unanswered to take a 52-45 lead of its own.

The Orange and Blue controlled the game the rest of the way, increasing the lead to double figures behind 67.9 percent shooting in the second half.

After the teams combined for 22 first-half turnovers, Illinois settled down with just two in the second half while N.C. State continued to struggle. The Wolfpack finished with 19 turnovers for the game, as the Illini recorded a season-high nine steals.

Illinois once again was strong on the glass, grabbing 11 offensive rebounds to earn a 19-to-8 advantage in second chance points.

Malcolm Hill led all scorers with 22 points, making all five baskets in the second half and getting to the foul line often (12-15). Hill just missed a double-double, also finishing with a game-high nine rebounds.

Tracy Abrams carried the Illini during the first half and ended up tying his season high with 17 points on 6-of-10 shooting along with a season-best three steals.

Leron Black had another strong performance, hitting a number of mid-range jumpers en route to 15 points with eight boards.

Game 9 Recap - Illini 64, VCU 46 (Dec. 3)

Illinois recorded its 1,750th win in program history, roaring back from an early deficit to beat VCU at the Hoophall Miami Invitational.

Illinois started slowly, making just one of its first 12 shots and falling behind 11-3. The Illini answered with a dominant 19-3 run and made 10 of its last 17 from the field to take a 10-point lead into the locker room.

VCU went on a 12-0 run shortly after the half to pull within 35-34. Tracy Abrams ended the run by draining a 3-pointer and a pair of Malcolm Hill free throws pushed the UI lead to six.

VCU managed just one field goal over the last nine minutes, and none in the final 7:30, as the Illini defense clamped down and Illinois outscored the Rams 20-to-6 down the stretch, turning a four-point lead into an 18-point victory.

Illinois won it with defense, holding VCU to its lowest point total in the last 11 seasons. The Rams shot just 30.2 percent, which included 2-of-18 from 3-point range. The Illini also turned 14 VCU turnovers into 23 points.

Leron Black was named MVP of the game after scoring a game-high and career-high tying 18 points along with a game-high 18 rebounds. Malcolm Hill added 16 points and dished out a season-high five assists, and **Jalen Coleman-Lands** also finished in double figures with 12.
