- Jason Gardner is in his third season as head coach. He joined the Jaguars following two seasons as an assistant at Memphis. As a collegiate player at Arizona, Gardner was the 2003 Naismith National Player of the Year.

**WHAT IS THE WOUNDED WARRIOR PROJECT?**

• Wounded Warrior Project is the beneficiary of the 2K Classic. The mission of Wounded Warrior Project is to honor and empower wounded warriors. WWP's purpose is to raise awareness and to enlist the public's aid for the needs of injured service members, to help injured servicemen and women aid and assist each other, and to provide unique, direct programs and services to meet their needs.

• In honor of Veterans Day on Nov. 11, Michigan honored members of the U.S. military in various ways throughout the Howard game, beginning with the introduction of the honorary captains with the Wounded Warrior Project. Army Specialist Dan Webb, a nine-year veteran from Cedar Springs, Michigan, and Marine Corporal Michael Koziak, a six-year veteran from Mona Shores, Michigan, were special guests of the men's basketball team at tonight's game and will also be in attendance at Sunday's game. They will also travel to New York City with the team for the championship round of the 2K Classic next week.

**A LITTLE BIT ABOUT MARQUETTE**

• Marquette returns four starters and nine letterwinners from last year's team that went 20-13 overall and 8-10 in the BIG EAST.

• Steve Wojciechowski returns for his third season as the head coach of the Golden Eagles. He has a 35-32 record at Marquette after spending 16 years on the Duke coaching staff.

• The Golden Eagles opened the 2016-17 season with a 95-71 win over Vanderbilt on Nov. 11 in Annapolis, Md. Jajuan Johnson led Marquette with 21 points and six steals while Luke Fischer added 18 points and seven rebounds.

• Marquette will play Howard on Monday night (Nov. 14) as part of the 2K Classic before making the trip to Madison Square Garden.

• Fischer averaged 12.1 points and 6.2 rebounds last season while Johnson had a team-best 51 steals.

• Marquette's lone lost starter – Henry Ellenson – was drafted by the Detroit Pistons with the 18th pick in the 2016 NBA Draft.

**A LITTLE BIT ABOUT SMU**

• SMU returns three starters and five letterwinners from last year's team that was 25-5 overall and 13-5 in the American Athletic Conference.

• Tim Jankovich takes over as the head coach of the Mustangs, replacing Larry Brown. Jankovich has a 10-0 record as he coached SMU's first nine games of last season with a suspension to Brown.

• SMU throttled Gardner-Webb, 72-44, on Friday night (Nov. 11) in its season opener. Semi Ojeleye had a game-high 26 points and made it a double-double with 14 rebounds.

• SMU will host Eastern Michigan on Sunday afternoon (Nov. 13) in its second game of the 2K Classic before making the trip to New York.

• Ben Moore and Shake Milton both were named to the Preseason All-AAC teams and Milton is on the watch list for the 2017 Jerry West Shooting Guard of the Year.

• SMU will be eligible for postseason play this year after being banned from the NCAA Tournament in 2015-16.

**A LITTLE BIT ABOUT PITT**

• Pittsburgh brings back a pair of starters and seven letterwinners from last year's team that went 21-12 overall and 9-9 in Atlantic Coast Conference play.

• The Panthers lost to Wisconsin, 47-43, in the first round of the 2016 NCAA Tournament in St. Louis, Mo.

• Kevin Stallings enters his first year at Pitt and his 24th season as a Division I head basketball coach. Stallings has a 456-283 overall record and was the head coach at Vanderbilt for 17 seasons.

• Pittsburgh will host Gardner-Webb on Monday night (Nov. 14) before making the trip to Madison Square Garden.

• The Panthers defeated Eastern Michigan, 93-90, in double overtime in its season and 2K Classic opener. Michael Young had 26 points and made it a double-double with 10 rebounds in the win. Jamel Artis had a team-high 27 points to go along with nine rebounds.

• Pitt was picked to finish 12th in the ACC Preseason Poll and Young earned a spot on the Preseason All-ACC second team.

**A WIN, FOR OPENERS**

• Michigan opened the 2016-17 season and the 2K Classic with a 76-58 win over Howard on Friday night (Nov. 11).

• U-M has now won its last 13 season openers and all 10 lidlifters with John Beilein as the head coach.

• Derrick Walton Jr. led all scorers with 20 points on 5-9 shooting from the floor and 4-of-7 from three-point range. Walton has scored 20 or more points in a game five times in his career and the Wolverines have won all five of those contests.

• DJ Wilson led the Wolverines with a career-high eight rebounds while adding nine points and two assists in the win over the Bison. He was also part of 28 bench points for the Wolverines as Mark Donnal had 12 points and six rebounds while going 6-of-7 from the free-throw line.

• Five Wolverines (Brent Hibbitts, Fred Wright-Jones, Xavier Simpson, Ibi Watson and Jon Teske) played in their first game in a Michigan uniform in the win over Howard. Simpson had five points and a pair of assists in 11 minutes of action while Watson scored his first two points in his Michigan career.

• The Wolverines' defense forced Howard into 17 turnovers on the night. Moritz Wagner and Derrick Walton Jr. led U-M with three steals apiece.

**2016-17 OUTLOOK**

• After returning to the NCAA Tournament last season, Michigan is back and hungry for more this season. With 10 returners and six new faces, the Wolverines have a mix of experience and youth to begin the season.

• Michigan had five departures from a year ago with two graduating seniors -- Caris LeVert and Spike Albrecht -- as well as three sophomore transfer -- Aubrey Dawkins (Central Florida), Rickey Doyle (Florida Gulf Coast)

and Kameron Chatman (Detroit).

- All five Michigan starters return for the 2016-17 season. Derrick Walton Jr., Zak Irvin and Mark Donnal return for their final year at U-M, while Duncan Robinson has two years of eligibility left after exploding onto the scene last season. Muhammad-Ali Abdur-Rahkman -- U-M's fifth starter last season -- returns coming off a Most Improved Player honors.
- The incoming freshman class is made up of guards Xavier Simpson (Lima, Ohio) and Ibi Watson (Pickerington, Ohio) as well as forward Austin Davis (Onsted, Mich.) and true center Jon Teske (Medina, Ohio). The Maize and Blue also added Charles Matthews after he transferred from Kentucky. Matthews will have to sit out this season due to NCAA transfer rules and will have three years of eligibility remaining.

NEW BENCH MEMBERS

- After losing long-time assistants Bacari Alexander (Detroit) and LaVall Jordan (Milwaukee) to Division I head coaching jobs, U-M coach John Beilein enlisted the help of two new assistant coaches, Billy Donlon (former head coach at Wright State) and Saddi Washington (associate head coach at Oakland). Together the duo brings a combined 30 years of experience with college basketball.

BASKETBALL TIDBITS

- Last season was the 100th in U-M Basketball history. This season, Crisler Center celebrates its 50th season.
- U-M coach John Beilein starts his 10th season with the Maize and Blue and his 39th as a college head coach. He has 190 wins with the Wolverines and he needs 10 more to reach the 200-win plateau and 19 to tie Johnny Orr for the all-time record (209).
- Overall, Beilein has 741 career wins in his 38 years on the bench. Just on the Division I level alone, he has 483 wins and needs just 17 to reach the DI 500-win plateau.
- Derrick Walton Jr. needs 98 points to become the 51st Wolverine to reach 1,000 career points. Senior teammate Zak Irvin has already reached the milestone, ranking 39th with 1,126 career points.
- Zak Irvin moved into U-M's top 10 all-time for three-point field goals made. He currently has 188 total putting him eighth. He needs two more to move into seventh, passed former Wolverine LaVell Blanchard (2000-03; 189).
- Incoming freshman Xavier Simpson was the 2016 Ohio Mr. Basketball. The last Wolverine to earn Ohio's top award was Trey Burke -- the 2013 National Collegiate Player of the Year.
- Incoming freshman Ibi Watson is from Pickerington, Ohio -- the same hometown of former Wolverine Caris LeVert, who was the 20th overall pick in the 2016 NBA Draft by the Brooklyn Nets.
- Sophomore Fred Wright-Jones was officially added to the roster this season as a walk-on. Wright-Jones started last season as a student manager before being elevated to a practice player due to team injuries.
- Over the last three seasons, U-M has lost a total of 136 games to injuries, but this year the Wolverines start with a full and healthy lineup.

RECORD BOOK WATCH

- U-M coach John Beilein has 190 wins at Michigan ranking him third all-time. He needs 10 more to become the second Wolverine coach to reach 200 and needs one (1) to move into second on the Wolverines all-time coaching list. He trails U-M legendary coaches Johnny Orr (209) and Bill Frieder (191).
- Overall, Beilein has 741 career wins in his 38 years on the bench. Just on the Division I level alone, he has 483 wins and needs just 17 to reach the DI 500-win plateau.
- Closing in on 1,000 points is Derrick Walton Jr., who needs just 98 points (902).
- Combining is DI and DIII numbers, Duncan Robinson needs just 47 (953) to reach 1,000 points. He has 405 points at U-M (DI) and scored 548 at Williams College (DIII, 2013-14).
- Zak Irvin moved into U-M's top 10 all-time for three-point field goals made. He currently has 188 total putting him eighth. He needs two (2) more to move into seventh -- held by former Wolverine LaVell Blanchard (2000-03; 189).
- Zak Irvin has 530 career long range attempts and is seventh all-time. He needs 59 to reach sixth held by Tim Hardaway Jr. (589; 2011-13). Irvin is the seventh Wolverine to reach 500-plus attempts and the ninth Wolverine to have 400-plus attempts.

INTERESTING TIDBITS

- Michigan is 50-1 under U-M coach John Beilein when the Wolverines score 80-or-more points. The lone loss came in an 86-82 decision at Maryland (Feb. 21).
- U-M has 29 wins against ranked foes under John Beilein -- 13 of which have been against top-10 teams.
- Michigan has won three of its last four games against top-five ranked opponent
  - > Jan. 12, 2015: No. 3 Maryland (W, 70-67)
  - > Dec. 13, 2014: at No. 3 Arizona (L, 80-53)
  - > Jan. 25, 2014: at No. 3 Michigan State (W, 80-75)
  - > Jan. 18, 2014: at No. 3 Wisconsin (W, 77-70)
- In nine seasons under Beilein at U-M, an opponent has reached 90-plus points just once. In fact, it was in his first season (2007-08) when U-M lost at 6/7 Duke, 95-67 -- just the ninth game into Beilein's Michigan tenure.
- Michigan has reached 100 points five times under Beilein, including twice this season -- vs. Charlotte (102) at the Battle 4 Atlantis and Youngstown State (105).

- Michigan is 15-7 in overtime games under John Beilein.
- With the win against Minnesota (Jan. 20), U-M assistant Jeff Meyer recorded his 700th win of his overall coaching career. He currently has 710. With that win, the U-M staff now has two 700-plus win coaches as U-M head coach John Beilein has 741 in his career.

## Game Notes

### IT'S BEEN A LONG THREE YEARS IN THE TRAINING ROOM

- Over the last three seasons, U-M has lost a total of 136 games to injuries.
- Michigan had 49 games lost to injury this season -- Spike Albrecht (28; hips), Caris LeVert (21; lower left leg), Derrick Walton Jr. (3; ankle) and D.J. Wilson (2; ankle).
- Last season, U-M had 58 games lost due to injuries to LeVert (14), Walton (12) and D.J. Wilson (27).
- Two seasons ago, U-M lost Mitch McGary for 29 games after he had his season cut short due to back surgery.

### A LITTLE 2015-16 MICHIGAN KNOWLEDGE

- Michigan finished 23-13 overall with a 10-8 mark in Big Ten play. The Wolverines earned the No. 8 seed in the Big Ten Tournament advancing to the semifinal and moved on to the NCAA Tournament playing in the First Four and First Round. Overall, U-M finished 58th in the RPI with a Strength of Schedule (SOS) rating of 48th.
- With a regular season win over Northwestern (Feb. 24), Michigan reached the 20-win plateau for the 27th time in U-M history and for the sixth time in U-M coach John Beilein's nine-year tenure.
- For the fourth time in the last five seasons, U-M posted 10-plus wins in conference play.
- Michigan used seven different starting lineups during the 2015-16 season. However, the Wolverines settled on a consistent lineup over their final 20 games -- Derrick Walton Jr., Muhammad-Ali Abdur-Rahkman, Duncan Robinson, Zak Irvin and Mark Donnal.
- Michigan had two players reach 1,000 points during the 2015-16 season -- Caris LeVert against Northern Kentucky (Dec. 15) and Zak Irvin at Ohio State (Feb. 16). Irvin currently has 1,115 (41st) career points, while LeVert finished his career with 1,070 total (44th). There are 50 Wolverines on the U-M's 1,000 point list.
- Zak Irvin scored a season-best 22 points in two upset victories over nationally ranked foes. First was against 3/3 Maryland (70-67; Jan. 12) followed by 18/16 Purdue (61-56; Feb. 13). He also led U-M with 17 points in the 72-69 win over 10/10 and No. 1 seed Indiana (March 11) in the Big Ten Tournament.
- Michigan smashed the single-season record for three-pointers with 342 total, topping the previous mark of 319 set in 2013-14. In fact, with six three-point field goals against No. 1 seed Indiana (March 11) in the Big Ten Tournament -- including Duncan Robinson's game-tying three-pointer and Kameron Chatman's final dagger -- U-M was able to help set a new mark.
- Duncan Robinson was ninth nationally shooting 45.0 percent from long range. With 95 total, he was just five shy of becoming the second Wolverine ever to reach 100 in a single season and six from the all-time single season mark of 101 by Louis Bullock set in the 1996-97 season.
- Starting guard Derrick Walton Jr. led U-M with four double-doubles -- all of which have come via points and rebounds. In fact, he added the program's fifth triple-double with 10 points, 11 rebounds and 13 assists against Youngstown State (Dec. 19). The 6-1 guard led U-M with 5.5 rebounds.
- U-M Coach Beilein has said he strives to have at least three players reach 100 assists in a season. U-M came close to reaching that mark with Derrick Walton (147) and Zak Irvin (107) getting there with Caris LeVert (74), Duncan Robinson (65) and Muhammad-Ali Abdur-Rahkman (61) coming close. Two seasons ago U-M had three players with 100-plus assists - Nik Stauskas (118), LeVert (109) and Walton (106).

### LEADERS AND BEST -- NATIONALLY

- Michigan was fifth (5th) nationally and a Big Ten best for personal fouls per game (15.5). U-M has been among the top 10 nationally for the last four years including a nation's best 14.2 per game average in 2013-14.
- Michigan was sixth (6th) nationally and a Big Ten best with 9.7 turnovers per game. Michigan had 18 games with fewer than 10 turnovers including a season-low six on four occasions.
- Michigan was 20th nationally with 9.5 three-pointers per game. U-M had 20 games this season with 10-plus three-pointers. In total, U-M made 342 three-pointers, which was ninth nationally.
- With its 14.9 assists per game (73rd nationally), the Wolverines were ninth (9th) nationally in assist-to-turnover ratio at 1.54.

### WHAT HAPPENED IN THE 2016 BIG TEN TOURNAMENT

- Michigan reached the semifinal of the Big Ten Tournament for the sixth time in school history after dramatic wins over No. 9 Northwestern and No. 1 Indiana before falling to No. 4 Purdue.
- Michigan won its first two games in dramatic fashion. U-M defeated No. 9 Northwestern 72-70 in overtime after Zak Irvin hit the game-winner with 2.2 seconds left, while Kameron Chatman's last second three-pointer lifted the Wolverines to a 72-69 win over No. 1 seed Indiana.
- Zak Irvin was named to the Big Ten Tournament's All-Tournament team becoming just the fourth Wolverine to do so -- Robert Traylor (1998), Jerod Ward (1998) and Nik Stauskas (2014). Irvin was joined on the All-Tournament team by Michigan State's Denzel Valentine (MVP), Purdue's A.J. Hammons and Vince Edwards and Nebraska's

Shavon Shields.

- Derrick Walton Jr.'s 12 assists against No. 1 seed Indiana set the Big Ten Tournament single-game record. The previous record was 11, held by five others, the last coming from Hoosier Ryan Tapak in 2004.
- Duncan Robinson averaged 12.0 points per game during the conference tournament. He tied a season-best with 21 against Northwestern and followed with 12 against Indiana. Robinson made five three-pointers, including making the game-tying three-pointers in both games. He tied the game against Northwestern at 70-70 before Zak Irvin hit the eventual game winner. He followed making another triple to tie Indiana at 69-69 before Kameron Chatman hit the game-winning triple as time expired.
- Muhammad-Ali Abdur-Rahkman posted 14.7 points per game after scoring 14 against Northwestern, 15 against Indiana and 15 against Purdue. He shot 54.5 percent from long range (6-for-11).

### WHAT HAPPENED IN THE 2016 NCAA TOURNAMENT

- Michigan made its first ever appearance in the First Four, defeating Tulsa, 67-62, in Dayton, Ohio.
- After falling behind 16-9, Michigan ended the first half on a 19-4 scoring run to take an eight-point lead into the half against Tulsa. In a back-and-forth second half, Zak Irvin hit a three-pointer with 53 seconds left to put the Wolverines up by two, and Michigan finished the game from the free throw line. Duncan Robinson recorded his first U-M double-double with 13 points and 11 rebounds.
- Michigan was defeated by Notre Dame's second-half rally, 70-63, in the first round of the tournament (March 18) after finishing the first half up 41-29 at the Barclays Center in Brooklyn, N.Y.
- The Wolverines jumped out to a 41-29 halftime lead over the Irish, but Notre Dame staged a comeback, including four ties and five lead changes eventually leading to a 70-63 final. Muhammad-Ali Abdur-Rahkman led U-M with 15 points while Derrick Walton Jr. garnered a career-high six steals and tallied 10 points and eight assists.
- Michigan had four players average in double figures with Muhammad-Ali Abdur-Rahkman leading the way with 15.5 per game, followed by Zak Irvin (12.5), Duncan Robinson (11.0) and Derrick Walton Jr. (11.0).

### THANK YOU, STAN VAN GUNDY

- So the question asked is how did Michigan get Duncan Robinson? The answer is simple -- Detroit Pistons coach and team president Stan Van Gundy. Yes, it seems interesting and the reason why is next.
- When Van Gundy took over the Pistons as head coach and President of Basketball Operations he hired Marist head coach Jeff Bower as his general manager.
- With Bower leaving Marist, Williams College head coach Mike Maker -- a former John Beilein assistant at West Virginia -- was hired to replace Bower, beating out Patrick Beilein for the job.
- With Maker leaving for Marist, he called John Beilein and told him to take a look at Robinson, who nearly led Williams to the DIII national title -- finishing as the runner-up.
- The next they say is history as Beilein watched tape and didn't want Robinson as a walk-on, but rather offered him a scholarship. Robinson was also looking at Davidson.

### HERE'S TO YOU MR. ROBINSON

- With all the research done to date and continued to be sought after, Duncan Robinson appears to be the first DIII player to transfer to DI and receive a major scholarship. There have been several DIII transfers to U-M, but none have been given a scholarship.
- Coming in with a reputation as a long-range shooter, Robinson has not disappointed, shooting 45.0 percent from long range in 2015-16, which was 9th nationally and second in the Big Ten.
- Robinson led U-M with 95 total three-point field goals last season, which was 33rd nationally. He 12 games with four-plus three-pointers, six games with five-plus threes. He made a season-best six three-pointers -- all in the first half -- against Northern Kentucky (Dec. 15).

### ADVANTAGE ... CRISLER CENTER

- U-M carries a 71-14 record at Crisler Center over its last five seasons -- including a 13-4 record last season.
- Over the five-plus year stretch, U-M has gone 35-5 in non-conference games and 36-9 in Big Ten games.
- Over the last five years, Michigan has sold out Crisler Center 46 games.

## Game Notes

### LONG RANGE BUCKET CONSISTENCY

- With U-M coach John Beilein's intricate offensive system, the Wolverines have been known for spreading the floor and utilizing the three-pointer to its advantage.
- U-M surpassed 300 for just the third time in program history with 342 total in 2015-16, which was ninth nationally and set the program season record, passing the 319 tallied in 2013-14.
- Michigan shot 38.0 percent from long range (38th nationally), averaged 9.5 per game (20th nationally) and had 25.0 attempts per game (13th nationally).
- U-M made 10-plus three-pointers in 20 games, including a season-best and program record 17 against Bryant (Dec. 23).
- All nine seasons under U-M coach John Beilein rank among the top 10 all-time for three-pointers made. The full list of long range shooting rankings with Beilein are below:

### PROTECTING THE BALL

- During U-M coach John Beilein's tenure, Michigan continues to be one of the nation's best teams at not turning over the ball. It was no different as U-M ranked sixth (6th) nationally and led the Big Ten with a 9.7 per game average.
- U-M posted 18 games with fewer than 10 turnover games including a season-low six, four times -- Houston Baptist (Dec. 5), Youngstown State (Dec. 19), Minnesota (Jan. 20) and Purdue (Feb. 13).
- Under U-M coach John Beilein, all nine of his seasons make up U-M's all-time top nine spots in U-M's top 10.
- In fact, during the last four seasons, U-M has ranked among the top 10 nationally, including leading the country during the 2013-14 season with a 9.32 per game average.

### NO NEED TO WHISTLE THE WOLVERINES

- Under U-M coach John Beilein, U-M has ranked above the nation's best for not fouling. In fact, the Wolverines have ranked among the top 15 in the nation in seven of the nine seasons.
- With this season's new freedom of play rules and points of emphasis U-M saw its personal foul numbers rise during the first half of the season, however in true Beilein fashion, adjustments were made to the new style of play, and U-M averaged 15.5 per game (5th nationally).
- Michigan led the nation in 2013-14 (14.2) and was second in 2012-13 (12.7).

### HE IS ALL ABOUT THE TEAM, THE TEAM, THE TEAM

- For the second straight season, Andrew Dakich asked to burn the redshirt he was hoping for in order to help U-M with injuries piling up, Spike Albrecht shutting down his season and other team needs.
- After sitting out the first nine games expecting to redshirt, Dakich played in his first game against Delaware State (Dec. 12) and posted career-best for points (4), rebounds (2) and assists (3) in a career-best 20 minutes.
- Overall, Dakich has played in 24 games and averages 4.6 minutes per game off the bench.
- In addition to Dakich, U-M managers Jon Rubenstein (sophomore; Ho-Ho-Kis, N.J.), Ryan Kapustka (sophomore; Grand Rapids, Mich.) and Fred Wright-Jones (freshman; Detroit, Mich.) were cleared and have become full-time scout team players.

### ANOTHER SPECIAL MOMENT BROUGHT TO YOU BY BEILEIN

- U-M coach John Beilein continues to appreciate the work and dedication of his walk-ons. In the regular season finale, he dressed freshman Fred Wright-Jones -- who has been a manager/practice player the entire season.
- Wright-Jones, who wore No. 14, is a native of Detroit, Mich., and played high school basketball at East English Village under Juan Rickman. He became a manager for the program and then was cleared to practice after Spike Albrecht announced he would miss the rest of the season.
- Last season, Beilein surprised manager/practice players Jon Rubenstein (#13) and Ryan Kapustka (#15) dressing them for the regular season finale against Rutgers (March 7, 2015).
- In fact, with the game in hand against the Scarlet Knights, both made their first appearances as Wolverines playing the final minutes. Rubenstein was even fouled but missed the front end of the 1-and-1 opportunity.

### WHAT HAPPENED TO U-M'S ROSTER SINCE THE 2013 RUN?

- It's hard to believe and refer to Michigan as rebuilding, however, the Wolverines continue to retool after losing five players to the NBA over the last four seasons. In fact, all five of those players were U-M's starting five from its 2013 NCAA Final Four run.
- Michigan's roster had two players remaining from that 2013 Final Four team -- Spike Albrecht and Caris LeVert.
- U-M players who left early and are in the NBA:
  - > Trey Burke, Washington Wizards; left as sophomore (2013 1st; No. 9)
  - > Tim Hardaway Jr., Atlanta Hawks; left as junior (2013 1st; No. 24)

  - > Glenn Robinson III, Indiana Pacers; left as a sophomore (2014 2nd; No. 40)

### THE NBA EFFECT ON THE WOLVERINE ROSTER

- Since 2013, Michigan has had five Wolverines leave early for the NBA -- the most in the Big Ten. The next closest is Ohio State and Indiana, who each had three leave players leave early.
- Michigan trails only Kentucky (11) and Arizona (6) for the most players to leave early for the pros since 2013. The Wolverines, Duke, Kansas, UCLA and UNLV have each had five leave early since 2013.

### WHAT HAPPENED TO AUSTIN HATCH?

- Austin Hatch altered his playing status in the summer of 2015 by moving to a medical scholarship and becoming an undergraduate student assistant. At his request, he asked the coaching staff for the change to concentrate on his academic studies, a decision that would "honor my father."
- In his only playing season, Hatch appeared in the waning minutes of five games during the 2014-15 season. He attempted two total three-pointers with one against Coppin State (Dec. 22) and one against Rutgers (March 7).
- With the Coppin State game in hand, Hatch entered the game and sank his first career point on a free throw after being fouled on a three-point attempt, which nearly went in. He was 1-for-3 from the line.
- The Coppin State was the first "official" stat for Hatch, but it was not the first time he scored. In U-M's only exhibition game of 2014-15 season, Hatch sank a free throw in the waning minutes, but the stats did not count.

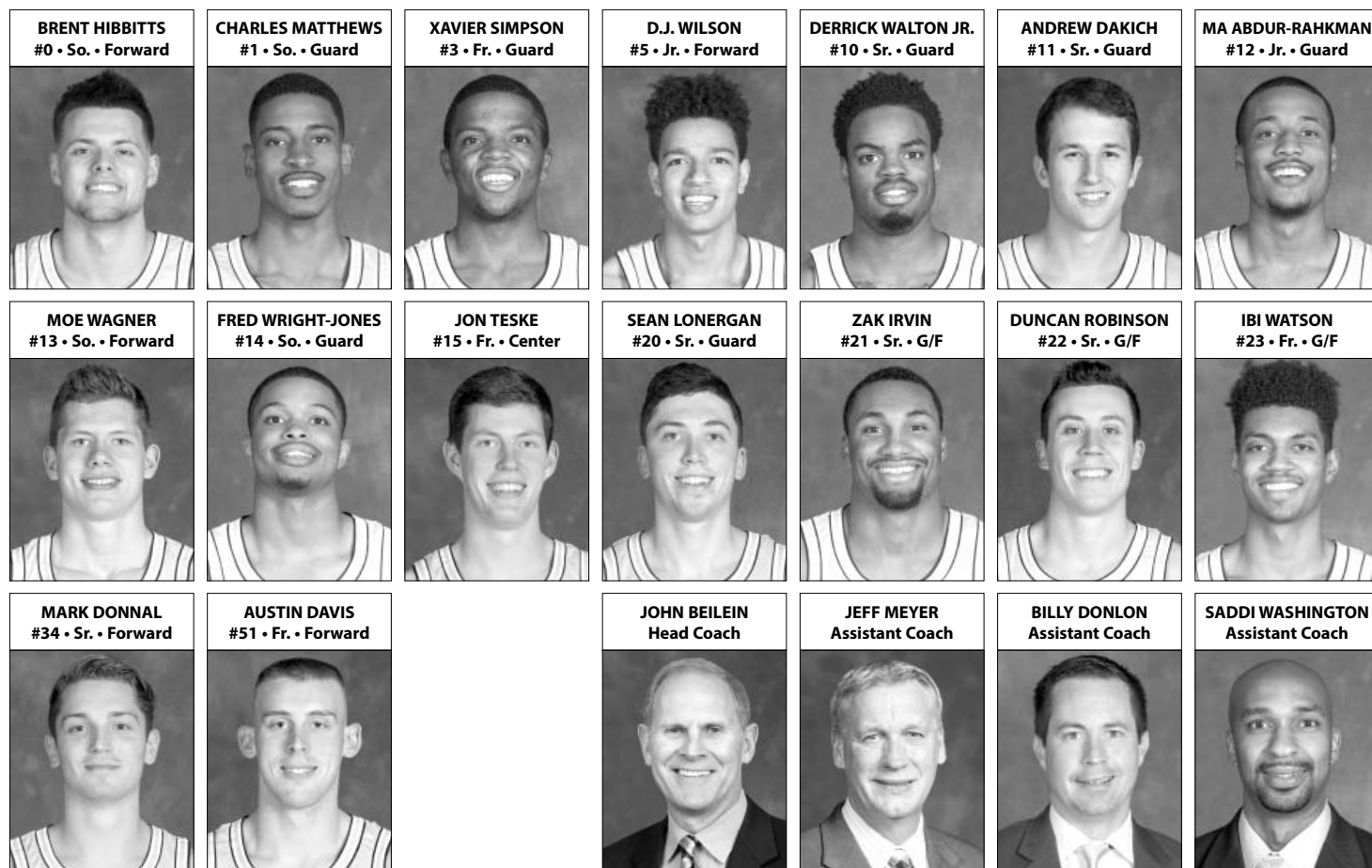

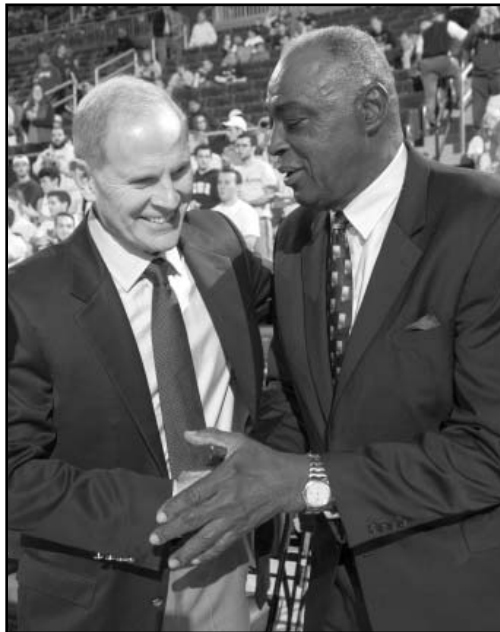
