Brandon Currie

Head Men's Coach - 3rd Season



Brandon Currie is starting his third season as Head Coach of the IUPUI Men's Tennis team. Currie is a former Butler University standout that has been active with the IUPUI tennis programs the past five years.

In just his second season at the helm of the IUPUI men's tennis program, Currie guided the Jaguars back to the Mid-Continent Conference Tournament, following a one-year absence. Currie also helped Gabriel Garcia rise to the Mid-Con Newcomer of the Year, along with Javier Saab, who was a Mid-Con Second Team selection.

Currie, who graduated from Butler in 2002 with a Bachelor of Science degree in Elementary Education, served as an Assistant Coach for the IUPUI men's team since 2003. He also assisted with the IUPUI women's team during the 2002-03 and 2003-04 seasons, helping guide the Jags to consecutive Mid-Continent Conference titles and NCAA Tournament berths.

Graduating as the most prolific tennis player in Butler history, Currie, who served as team captain all four years, holds schools records for most singles and doubles wins. He was named First Team All-Conference by the Horizon League every year of his collegiate career. He was the Horizon League Newcomer of the Year his freshman year and followed that by capturing conference Player of the Year honors each of his final three seasons. Currie was selected as the Butler Male Athlete of the Year following his senior year.

During Currie's career, Butler captured Horizon League titles and participated in the NCAA Tournament three times. In his senior season, Currie was ranked 30th in the nation in doubles and 60th in singles by the Intercollegiate Tennis Association.

Since graduation, the Milwaukee, Wis.-native has worked for two summers as the Head Tennis Pro at Woodstock Country Club in addition to working as a teaching pro at the Carmel Racquet Club.

He has also participated periodically in professional tournaments, both locally and on the ATP Satellite circuit. He won the Pierson Ford Open in 2003 and the Tim and Tom Gullickson Memorial Tournament in 2004.

Currie is the seventh head coach in the history of the men's tennis program.

Ross Gehlhausen

Assistant Men's Coach - 1st Season



Ross Gehlhausen is in his first year as an assistant coach at IUPUI. Prior to joining the Jaguars coaching staff, Gehlhausen compiled one of the most impressive resumes in the school's men's tennis history, setting school records for both singles matches played (117) and doubles matches played (102).

In his senior season, Gehlhausen helped lead the Jaguars back to the Mid-Continent Conference Tournament after a two-year absence. In recording 10 singles wins in the 2006-07 season, Gehlhausen elevated himself to second-winningest singles player in IUPUI history.

One of IUPUI's top student-athletes, Gehlhausen was named to the IUPUI Academic Advisor's List in six of eight semesters. Additionally, he was selected Mid-Continent Conference Academic All-Conference in three years and was chosen a Collegiate All-American Scholar by the United State Achievement Academy in 2004-05 and 2003-04.

Pat Nickell

Assistant Men's Coach - 2nd Season



Pat Nickell enters his second season as an assistant on Brandon Currie's staff. Last season, he helped the Jaguars finish fourth in the Mid-Continent Conference, earning a spot in the league's postseason tournament. He currently is a teaching professional at the Southside Tennis Club in Indianapolis.

Previously, Nickell spent four years as the head men's tennis coach at the University of Indianapolis from 2000-04. He first season at UIndy, the Greyhounds won a school record 19 matches, while the squad boasted the Great Lakes Valley Conference Player of the Year. In 2001-02, he led the 'Hounds to their first-ever NCAA Division II national ranking, while leading the team to its second straight ITA All-Academic Team honor.

In 2003, UIndy earned an NCAA Tournament berth and its second year in the Division II polls. During his four years, Indianapolis compiled a 26-7 record in GLVC play.

Prior to that, Nickell spent three years as the head men's and women's coach at Quincy University in Quincy, Ill. While there, he built the new Division II programs from the ground up, leading them to three straight GLVC tournament berths.

The past four summers, he's served as an instructor at the University of Notre Dame and University of Kentucky tennis camps.

Nickell graduated from the University of Kentucky in 1982 with a degree in economics.

WOMEN'S COACHING STAFF

Cameron Benjamin

Head Women's Coach - 1st Season

Cameron Benjamin became the fourth head coach in the history of the IUPUI women's tennis program on Jan. 22, 2008. The Indianapolis-native brings a vast array of tennis experience to the Jaguars' program.



Benjamin played both Lawrence Central and North Central High Schools and coached at Pike and Ben Davis High Schools following a successful career at Bowling Green State University. Upon graduating from North Central High School, where she finished third in the Indiana High School State Tennis Tournament, Benjamin starred at Bowling Green (Ohio), serving as a co-captain on the Falcons' 2004-05 team.

The first African-American player in the school's tennis history, Benjamin was named the team's Player of the Year following the 2002-03 campaign. Benjamin finished her career with 48 singles wins, ranking 16th in school history.

Benjamin takes the reigns of a program that has reached the Summit League (formerly Mid-Continent Conference) Tournament in eight of the last nine seasons, including the last six consecutive years.

Benjamin replaces Andrea Lord, who resigned in November 2007, citing personal reasons.

"We look forward to Cameron continuing to grow the athletics and academics success of the IUPUI Women's Tennis program," IUPUI Athletics Director Michael Moore said.

TUPUI Athletics History

The birth of the intercollegiate athletics program at IUPUI occurred January 14, 1971, when the Faculty Council approved a recommendation from its Athletics Affairs Committee that "IUPUI engage in intercollegiate sports and become a regular member of the NCAA as soon as possible."

In making its recommendations, the committee said it felt that "intercollegiate sports were necessary to complete the University's relationship to the community at large and to its alumni." The committee went on to say that it felt that an intercollegiate program would be "a positive morale factor for students and would help develop an identification with the institution."

The IUPUI intercollegiate athletics program officially began competition during the 1972-73 academic year with the introduction of men's basketball as the university's first varsity sport. The men's program expanded during the 1974-75 season with the addition of golf and tennis to varsity status, and then again in the 1987-88 academic year when soccer gained varsity status. Baseball replaced golf as a varsity sport during the 1979-80 campaign. Men's golf was reintroduced to the intercollegiate lineup in 1994-95.

Intercollegiate athletics at IUPUI expanded to include women's sports in 1975-76, with the introduction of basketball, softball and volleyball as varsity sports. Women's tennis was added in 1989-90.

IUPUI received national acclaim in the sports world in 1987 when the Pan American Games were hosted in Indianapolis and on the downtown campus. With the hosting of the event, world class facilities for swimming, track, soccer and softball were built across the south end of campus.

With the addition of men's and women's cross country and women's swimming and diving in the fall of 1997, the IUPUI intercollegiate athletic program was represented by 12 intercollegiate teams that completed at the NCAA Division II level.

In the beginning, the intercollegiate program was unaffiliated except for an associate membership in the NCAA. In 1978, IUPUI joined the National Association of Intercollegiate Athletics (NAIA), and in January of 1993, the institution's application for membership in Division II of the NCAA was approved.

While affiliated with the NAIA, IUPUI teams won 32 state and regional championships. IUPUI reached the Sweet Sixteen in men's basketball (1989-90), the Final Four in women's basketball (1990-91) and finished second nationally in women's volleyball (1991-92). Beginning in 1983, the IUPUI softball team made nine consecutive appearances in the NAIA National Tournament, finishing as high as third on three occasions.

Intercollegiate athletics at IUPUI made its way to the National Collegiate Athletic Association Division I level as the Trustees of Indiana University approved the move at their Oct. 30, 1997 meeting in New Albany. That opened the door for IUPUI to join a new level of competition in the NCAA.

IUPUI then was admitted into the Summit League (formerly Mid-Continent

Conference), announced Nov. 11, 1997 at a press conference on the campus of IUPUI. Upon entrance to the Mid-Con, IUPUI was involved in scheduling and competition for championships beginning in the 1998-99 academic year. The addition of men's swimming and diving and women's soccer in the fall of 1998 brought IUPUI's total to 14 sports. The total was bumped to 15 on Oct. 20, 1999, when the university announced that women's golf would become a varsity sport starting in 2000. The total dropped back to 14 when the university announced on May 18, 2001, the discontinuation of the baseball program.

IUPUI has enjoyed considerable success in its first nine years as a Division I school, not only athletically, but academically.

The Jaguars have earned NCAA Tournament bids in men's soccer, men's golf, men's basketball and women's tennis as well as Mid-Con Championships in volleyball and men's tennis. IUPUI student-athletes have been recognized as Mid-Con Athletes of the Year nine times, with coaches earning numerous Coach of the Year honors.

IUPUI's athletic teams have also excelled in the classroom. The women's tennis team has been chosen as an All-Academic Team by the Intercollegiate Tennis Association for four consecutive years. The men's cross country team has been recognized by the United States Cross Country Coaches Association as Academic All-American the past four seasons, while the women's team earned the same honor from the Women's Intercollegiate Cross Country Coaches Association six times. In 2001-02, the women's basketball team was selected by the Women's Basketball Coaches Association to its Top 25 Honor Roll. In the fall of 2002, the athletic department as a whole was honored by The USA Today and the NCAA for having the highest improvement in graduation rate in the country for its category. In 2003, The USA Today and NCAA recognized IUPUI again - this time for graduating more than the previously counted cohort.

Individually, IUPUI has had two student-athletes earn First Team Academic All-America honors, while making a precent of ranking among the conference leaders in academic honorees.

IUPUI has also established a pattern of commitment to serving their community. The Jaguars have averaged over nearly 1,100 hours of community service the past four years, taking part in youth clinics, hosting a Canned Food Drive and Adopt-A-Family programs and participating in several charity walk-a-thons.



Indianapolis also boasts the Indianapolis Zoo, located just west of downtown. The zoo is home to over 3,000 animals in simulated natural habitats and 1,700 species of plants. It is the only facility in the U.S. to be accredited as a zoological park, botanical garden and aquarium. The zoo became the first tenant of the White River State Park in 1988.

Charles R. Bantz, IU Executive Vice President and fourth chancellor of IUPUI, assumed office on June 1, 2003.



Chancellor Bantz serves on the Board of Directors for Indianapolis Downtown Inc., Indiana Sports Corporation and United Way of Central Indiana. He is also a member of the Greater Indianapolis Progress Committee and the Crows Nest Town Board.

He is married to Dr. Sandra Petronio, who holds faculty appointments at IUPUI in the Department of Communication Studies, the Center on Bioethics and the IU Schools of Nursing and Informatics.



Robert E. Martin *Vice Chancellor for Administration & Finance*

Robert E. Martin has served as Vice Chancellor for Administration and Finance at IUPUI since 1995. He has worked at IUPUI since 1969 serving as Director of Administrative Affairs, Special Assistant to the University Controller, Campus Bursar and IU School of Nursing Business Manager.

Martin serves as Chairman of the Board for the Indiana Member's Credit Union. He is a board member of the Indiana Members Financial Services, Indiana/World Skating Academy, National Institute for Fitness and Sport and White River State Park Development Commission. He is also a member of Indiana College & University Business Officers, National Association of College and University Business Officers, National Association of College Auxiliary Services, Ball State University Alumni Association and the Indiana University Alumni Association.

Martin attended Ball State University where he received a Bachelor of Science degree in 1966. In 1976, he earned a Masters in Public Administration from IUPUI.

Michael Moore *Director of Athletics*

Michael R. Moore has served as IUPUI's Director of Athletics since July 1, 1996. During his tenure, IUPUI has been reclassified NCAA Division I, accepted as a member of the Summit League (formerly Mid-Continent Conference) and fully certified under the NCAA Athletics Certification Program.

Jaguars Athletics has also expanded from nine to 14 varsity programs (six men and eight women).

Under Moore's direction, IUPUI has experienced both athletic and academic success. The 2000 men's soccer team made the first NCAA Tournament in IUPUI's history. Since then, women's tennis (2003, 2004), men's golf (2002, 2005) and men's basketball (2003) have all participated in NCAA Championships. The men's soccer (1999), volleyball (2000) and men's tennis (2004) teams have won regular season league titles. IUPUI also captured USA Today/NCAA Academic Achievement Awards in 2002 and 2003.

Last year, Moore restructured IUPUI's academic support system, resulting in record highs in 3.0 student-athletes and departmental grade point averages.

Moore has served as Chair of the Mid-Continent Conference Director's Council and as President of the NCAA I-AAA Athletics Director Association. He is currently the Summit League's representative to the NCAA Division I Management Council.

Prior to assuming his present position, the Lancaster, Ohio-native was the Senior Associate Director of Athletics and Development at the University of Evansville from 1988-96. Academic Facilities

Over the past five years, IUPUI's campus has grown by leaps and bounds. The recent construction of Inlow Hall (home of the Lawrence School of Law), the Informatics and Communications Technology Complex and Eskenazi Hall (which houses the IU Herron School of Art) puts the IUPUI campus among the nation's elite academic facilities.

Campus Life

IUPUI recently broke ground on a new \$50 million Campus Center that will become an icon for the urban research university. The plans call for a 179-foot bell tower of limestone and glass that will serve as a navigational point for people on and off campus. The building will also feature a 250-seat theater, 600-seat dining area and a 1,000-seat multi-purpose room. It is estimated that 8,000-10,000 people will utilize the facility on a daily basis.

Athletics Facilities

The IUPUI campus boasts some of the nation's premier athletic facilities including the IU Natatorium and the Michael A. Carroll Track & Soccer Stadium. The Natatorium is among the fastest olympic sized pools in the world and has been the venue of 90 American records and 11 world records.

The Track & Soccer Stadium has hosted prestigious events including past U.S. Olympic Team Trials and the U.S. Open Cup Soccer Finals. Built in 1982, the stadium originally cost \$7 million and received a new drainage system, track surface and soccer field in 1997. In 1998, a state-of-the-art timing system was installed.

Also on the IUPUI campus is the Indianapolis Tennis Center and the National Institute for Fitness and Sport. The Tennis Center is the annual host of the RCA Championships and features six indoor courts and both clay and hardcourt outdoor surfaces.

The National Institute for Fitness and Sport (NIFS) is a 65,000 square-foot facility that includes a 200 meter indoor running/walking track and a regulation basketball court. There are over 100 pieces of cardio equipment and more than 40 group fitness classes offered. The facility also offers a complete free weight room, comfortable locker rooms complete with a sauna,

steam rooms and whirlpools.

IUPUI student-athletes from all 14 varsity sports do much of their weight training and conditioning at the facility.

Michael A. Carroll Golf Outing

It is difficult to overstate the importance of the late Michael A. Carroll to the birth and development of the athletics program at IUPUI. For more than a decade, he was its number one advocate, fund-raiser and cheerleader. In 1981, he organized what is now the Jaguars Athletics Club. A year later, he coordinated the IUPUI fund raising golf outing that now bears his name. Until his untimely death in a 1992 mid-air plane crash, this former Lilly Endowment executive nurtured, nudged and lassoed many Indianapolis business leaders to share his vision for a "big league" collegiate athletics program at IUPUI.

Although he carried other enormous responsibilities in a civic and political career that spanned 25 years, IUPUI's growth seemed to be Mike's most enthusiastic avocation. IUPUI's evolution into NCAA Division I status would have left him beaming. However, he would have been the first to remind us that IUPUI is still a masterpiece in progress, never a finished work of art.

Basketball Tipoff Luncheon

The drive to the men's and women's basketball NCAA tournament begins with the tipoff luncheon. This is your chance to meet the men's and women's basketball teams and hear a preview of the upcoming season from head coaches Ron Hunter and Shann Hart. Widely known as one of the department's marquee events, the day typically features cutting edge multimedia in an intimate atmosphere, leaving the audience asking for more.

Athletics Auction

The auction is an exciting event, but the underlying message is serious - IUPUI's successful athletics program needs your support. The kickoff party will jump start the auction experience, providing an opportunity for alumni, family and friends to take part in an event to help support our outstanding student-athletes.

Jaguars Jaunt

The goal of the IUPUI Athletics Department is to provide students with the opportunity to compete in athletics while at the same time, earn a degree from one of the top two academic programs in the country. One way to provide such opportunities is through this new fall event to raise funds for women's scholarships. With more scholarship dollars, more female students will have a chance at a higher education. By participating in the walk, you are giving a gift that will make a huge impact to the overall athletics program.

Senior Student-Athlete Brunch

The mission of the Senior Brunch is simple - to celebrate the distinguished playing careers of IUPUI's graduating student-athletes. In its fourth year of existence, the Senior Brunch also marks the day when the end-of-year major awards are given out, while allowing all 11 IUPUI head coaches the opportunity to speak about their respective senior classes.

COMMUNITY ROLE MODELS

"As an urban campus located in the heart of Indiana's capital city and accessible to the largest range of students, IUPUI's core mission is providing quality educational opportunities," IUPUI Chancellor Charles Bantz said. "IUPUI will continue to enhance the resources of the city and region through teaching and learning, research and scholarship and civic engagement."

IUPUI earned the Mid-Continent Conference Sportsmanship Award in 2001, judged by its peers to be best in the league in demonstrating the ideals of sportsmanship.

IUPUI's student-athletes and coaches take responsibility to the community and academics as seriously as their commitment to their team. IUPUI men's basketball coach Ron Hunter was honored by the Black Coaches Association for "Images in Excellence", while the IUPUI softball, soccer, volleyball and cross country teams are easily among the most active community role models in the Central Indiana-area.

The IUPUI Athletics Department as a whole has been recognized by the NCAA and The USA Today twice in the past eight years for academic prowess.

As a group, IUPUI coaches, student-athletes and administrators put in nearly 1,800 hours during the 2006-07 year in community service activities. Since 2003, the department has averaged over 1,300 hours of community service activities per year. Student-athletes and coaches participated in clinics, speaking engagements and awareness programs, to name a few. THE SUMMIT LEAGUE HISTORY

Now in its 26th year as an NCAA Division I athletics conference, The Summit League is in its first year under that name. In May 2007, the Presidents Council embraced the Summit Plan, a strategic plan that places a renewed emphasis on improving the academic and athletic performances of all its student-athletes. Included in the plan was the creation of a new image of the conference and the unveiling of a new name. The Summit League is the third name the conference has held as an NCAA sanctioned league.

The Summit League's current member schools are Centenary College of Louisiana, IPFW (Indiana University-Purdue University-Fort Wayne), IUPUI (Indiana University-Purdue University Indianapolis), UMKC (University of Missouri-Kansas City), North Dakota State University, Oakland University, Oral Roberts University, South Dakota State University, Southern Utah University and Western Illinois University. The member schools pride themselves on providing quality athletic, academic and social experiences for their student-athletes.

The Summit League sponsors 19 championship sports, which include: baseball, men's and women's basketball, men's and women's cross country, men's and women's golf, men's and women's soccer, softball, men's and women's swimming & diving, men's and women's indoor track & field, men's and women's outdoor track & field, men's and women's tennis, and volleyball.

A review of the Summit League's highlights over the past 25 years:

1982-83

- The Association of Mid-Continent Universities is founded with "Frosty" Ferzacca as its first commissioner.
- The initial AMCU line-up includes Cleveland State, Eastern Illinois, Illinois-Chicago, Northern Iowa, SW Missouri State, Valparaiso, Western Illinois and Wisconsin-Green Bay.

1983-84

- UW-Green Bay and Eastern Illinois each play in the NCAA Men's Soccer Tournament, making them the league's first NCAA Tourney teams in any sport.
- Cleveland State earns the AMCU's first national recognition in the NCAA Men's Basketball Tournament, upsetting No. 3 seed Indiana on their way to a Sweet 16 appearance.
- Southwest Missouri State begins a string of five consecutive postseason appearances by reaching the quarterfinals of the NIT.

1987-88

- Ferzacca steps down as commissioner and is replaced by Jerry Ippoliti.
- Eastern Illinois Jim Maton is the league's first NCAA national champion, winning the 800-meter run at the NCAA Indoor Track Championship.
- The AMCU sends two teams to men's basketball postseason play for the third straight season.

1989-90

- The AMCU sends a conference-record three teams

to postseason play in men's basketball, including Northern Iowa, which upsets third-seeded Missouri in the first round of the NCAA Tournament.

- The AMCU changes its name to the Mid-Continent Conference.

1991-92

- The league announces that it will begin sponsoring women's athletics – strengthened by the membership of seven former North Star Conference members – the following year with the debut of six champion ship sports.
- Eastern Illinois' Dan Steele wins the 400-meter intermediate hurdles at the NCAA Outdoor Track & Field Championship.

1992-93

- UW-Milwaukee wins the first Mid-Con-sponsored women's championship when it takes home the cross country crown.
- Northern Illinois makes the first NCAA appearance by a Mid-Con women's team in the NCAA Women's Basketball Tournament.
- Wright State's Brian Anderson is the third overall pick in the Major League Baseball draft after winning his second consecutive Mid-Con Pitcher of the Year award.

1993-94

- Northern Illinois' volleyball squad posts the league's first women's NCAA Tourney win with a three-game triumph over Illinois State.
- UW-Green Bay upsets future NBA star Jason Kidd's fifth-seeded California squad in the first round of the NCAA Men's Basketball Tourney.
- Six schools depart the Mid-Con at the conclusion of the season.

1994-95

- The conference adds Buffalo, Central Connecticut State, Chicago State, UMKC, Northeastern Illinois and Troy State.
- Jon Steinbrecher begins a league record nine-year tenure at the Mid-Con helm when he replaces Ip-politi as commissioner.
- Valparaiso begins a string of five straight regular-season titles and six consecutive Mid-Con Tournament titles in men's basketball.

1995-96

- Charter member Eastern Illinois departs the Mid-Con, but not until after winning its ninth men's outdoor track and field title.
- Oral Roberts and Southern Utah join the Mid-Con.
- The Mid-Con becomes one of few NCAA Division I conferences across the nation to simultaneously run its basketball championships at the same time at a neutral site.
- Valparaiso reaches the NCAA "Sweet 16," thanks to the efforts of NBA draftee Bryce Drew, who hits "The Shot" to beat No. 4 seed Mississippi which eventually earns him an ESPY from ESPN.
- Youngstown State earns the first Mid-Con women's NCAA tourney win, topping fifth-seeded Memphis in the first round.

1997-98

- Oral Roberts and Southern Utah join the Mid-Con.
- The Mid-Con becomes one of few NCAA Division I conferences across the nation to simultaneously run its basketball championships at the same time at a neutral site.
- Valparaiso reaches the NCAA "Sweet 16," thanks to the efforts of NBA draftee Bryce Drew, who hits "The Shot" to beat No. 4 seed Mississippi which eventually earns him an ESPY from ESPN.
- Youngstown State earns the first Mid-Con women's NCAA tourney win, topping fifth-seeded Memphis in the first round.

1998-99

- IUPUI and Oakland begin competition in the Mid-Con.
- Associate member DePaul reaches the NCAA Softball College World Series, posting a third-place finish, and sets a Mid-Con single-season record with 54 wins.

2000-01

- Oakland women's soccer player Anita Rapp – a two-time Mid-Con Player of the Year and a WUSA draftee – earns a Gold Medal while playing for her native Norway in the 2000 Olympic Games.
- The Mid-Con renames its Women's All Sports Award for retiring Western Illinois Director of Athletics Dr. Helen Smiley.

2001-02

- UMKC captures the conference's first-ever NCAA Men's Soccer College Cup win, a 2-1 overtime triumph over former league member UW-Milwaukee.
- Oral Roberts' Krista Ragan becomes the first player in league history to earn four first-team all-conference citations in women's basketball.
- Valparaiso posts the biggest turnaround in NCAA women's basketball history (from 7-22 in 2000-01 to 26-7 in 2001-02) on its way to reaching the quarterfinals of the WNIT.
- UMKC's Matt Voelker earns outdoor track & field All-American honors in the high jump.

2002-03

- The Mid-Con sets a league record by sending four teams combined – IUPUI (NCAA) and Valparaiso (NIT) on the men's side and Valparaiso (NCAA) and Western Illinois (WNIT) on the women's side – to basketball postseason play.
- Oral Roberts' Marsha Dawkins earns All-America honors in the 400 meter dash at both the NCAA Indoor and Outdoor Track and Field Championships.
- IUPUI women's basketball player Tiffany Kyser is Indiana's recipient of the NCAA "Woman of the Year" award (she is also a finalist for the national award).
- Steinbrecher resigns as commissioner and is replaced by Ron Bertovich.

2003-04

- Centenary begins Mid-Con play.
- Oakland's swimming & diving programs set league records for consecutive titles when they sweep the Mid-Con Championships for the fifth straight time.
- The Mid-Con sends two teams (UMKC, Oakland) to the NCAA Men's Soccer College Cup for the second time in league history.
- Oral Roberts' Caleb Green and Ken Tutt are the nation's highest scoring freshman duo.
- Oral Roberts baseball team sets a league record with 50 wins, posting two wins in the NCAA Tournament and finishes the season ranked in all four college polls.
- Southern Utah becomes the first Mid-Con school to sweep the men's and women's cross country and indoor and outdoor track & field crowns in the

same year.

- Oral Roberts' Prince Mumba (800 meter) and Western Illinois' Aubrey Martin (shot put) earn All-America honors at the NCAA Outdoor Track & Field Championship.
- Mumba runs for his native Zambia in the 2004 Athens Olympics, while Valparaiso's Joaquin Gomes plays for the Angolan Olympic basketball team.
- The Mid-Con Men's All Sports Award is renamed for retiring Valparaiso Director of Athletics Dr. William Steinbrecher.

2004-05

- Oral Roberts' Faithy Kamangila finishes 11th at the NCAA Cross Country Championships to become the first woman in school history to garner All-America honors.
- In its first-ever NCAA Tournament appearance, Oakland notches a win over Alabama A&M in the opening round of the NCAA Tournament before falling to eventual national champion North Carolina in the first round.
- Oral Roberts has five players selected in the Major League Baseball Draft, while Oakland's Paul Phillips is the top Mid-Con player chosen (ninth round).
- ORU's Mable Kunihira garnered All-American honors at the Outdoor Track & Field Championships with a fifth-place finish in the 800-meter run.

2005-06

- Eastern Illinois and South Dakota State are added as associate members in the sport of men's and women's swimming & diving.
- The Oral Roberts baseball team becomes the first Mid-Con team to advance to the NCAA Baseball Super Regionals with wins over Oklahoma State and Arkansas.
- Western Illinois' Zane Teilane becomes the first Mid-Con women's basketball player to be drafted when she is the 35th overall pick in the WNBA Draft by the Detroit Shock.
- Oakland's Chris Sullivan earns All-America honors in the 100 butterfly and 100 freestyle at the 2006 NCAA Swimming & Diving Championships.
- Western Illinois' Aubrey Martin (shot put) and Oral Roberts' Prince Mumba (800 meters) garner All-American honors twice – at the NCAA Indoor Track & Field Championships and NCAA Outdoor Track & Field Championships.
- WIU's Jennifer Gilson takes home All-America accolades at the 2006 NCAA Indoor Track & Field Championships, while ORU's Diana Chelimo also earns All-American honors at the 2006 NCAA Outdoor Track & Field Championships.
- Ron Bertovich resigns as commissioner and is replaced by Tom Douple.
- Chicago State leaves the Mid-Continent Conference following the 2005-06 academic year.

2006-07

- Southern Utah's Jess Baumgartner finishes third at the 2006 NCAA Cross Country Championships to earn All-American honors. It is the highest finish ever by a Mid-Con student-athlete.
- Oral Roberts' Caleb Green becomes the Mid-Con's all-time leading scorer and rebounder. He also becomes the first four-time first team All-Mid-Con selection in men's basketball and just the 15th Division I men's basketball player to be named conference player of the year three times. Green and teammate Ken Tutt become just the seventh set of teammates in NCAA Division I history to reach the 2,000-point plateau.
- Oral Roberts' Elisha Turek becomes the first player in league history to record more than 2,000 points and 1,000 rebounds. She finished her career with 2,046 points and a league-best 1,167 rebounds.
- The Mid-Con has six Indoor Track & Field All-Americans as Oral Roberts' Jonathan Rivers, Ernest Stranz, Kevin Cave and Andreotti Bain claim the honors in the 4x400 relay, while Bain (400 meter run), ORU's Shaun Smith (800 meter run) and Valparaiso's Laura Rolf (mile run) take home individual awards.
- Oral Roberts' Shaun Smith and Mable Kunihira are All-Americans in outdoor track in the 800 meters.
- Oral Roberts wins its 10th-consecutive baseball and women's golf championships, both records for all sports.
- On June 1, 2007, the conference officially changes its name to The Summit League.
- One month later on July 1, 2007, Indiana University-Purdue University-Fort Wayne, North Dakota State and South Dakota State join The Summit League. Charter member Valparaiso leaves the conference.
